5.1 The Role of the Departmental Records Officer

5.1.1 In some government departments the ultimate decision about destroying records held in registered files is made centrally by the staff of the Departmental Records Officer. Within MOD Head of DG Info-Records, who is the DRO, has delegated authority to business units to review the records they hold and, in most cases, destroy locally those records which are not considered worthy of permanent preservation. This can be done when the records cease to have administrative value.

5.1.2 The exception to this rule is that all registered files containing TOP SECRET and Codeword material are to be forwarded to DG Info-Records and are not to be destroyed locally, though the recommendation to DG Info-Records may be that they can be destroyed.

5.1.3 All other registered files (and unregistered records) which are identified by the business unit as

meriting consideration for permanent preservation are to be sent to DG Info-Records in accordance with the instructions in Chapter 8. Certain Air Force department files may initially be sent to the Air Historical Branch (RAF) with the prior agreement of both the AHB and DG Info-Records¹. Once received they will be reviewed centrally to determine whether permanent preservation is warranted.

5.1.4 DG Info-Records conducts two reviews of registered files, the first 5 years after the closure of the file (or within a short time of its receipt if it has been kept by the business unit for a longer period). Files which do not merit permanent preservation are marked for destruction, either straight away or at a predetermined point in the future, taking into account the recommendation made by the originating business unit.

5.1.5 Those files which appear to merit permanent preservation are reviewed again some 20 years later. The second review allows a judgement to be made about the historical context of the records. Files which are selected for permanent preservation are normally passed to the Public Record Office 30 years after their closure and are then made available to the public in line with the terms of the Public Records Act of 1967.

5.1.6 Records which are not held in registered files are normally reviewed by DG Info-Records 5 years and (where applicable) 25 years after their creation

5.2 The Role of the Business Unit Holding the Records

5.2.1 Delegated authority allows each business unit greater flexibility to manage their records efficiently but confers a responsibility upon them to review the records they hold and dispose of them in an appropriate and timely manner.

5.2.2 This chapter outlines the procedures to be followed by business units to ensure that an effective system of review is maintained allowing those records which are no longer needed, and do not merit permanent preservation, to be destroyed, while records which are needed for administrative purposes are kept for the appropriate period and those which appear to merit permanent preservation are forwarded to DG Info-Records.

5.2.3 In reviewing the records which they hold, each business unit should consider the appropriate length of time that a file, or any other type of record, is likely to be needed for administrative purposes.

5.2.4 Having made that decision, the business unit is also well placed to make an initial judgement about the likely historical value of a file (or other type of record). To aid the business unit in making that judgement Annex A to this chapter contains guidelines on the type of records likely to merit permanent preservation. In assessing whether a file meets these criteria remember that it is the responsibility of the lead business unit to identify such files and forward them to DG Info-Records. If your file merely contains copies of correspondence relating to a topic for which another business unit has lead responsibility the file need not be forwarded to DG Info-Records.

5.2.5 There is also a need to consider whether classified material generated by the business unit which is to be retained for administrative or historical reasons continues to merit its original protective marking, or whether it should be downgraded.

5.2.6 Records which are held in electronic form are no less worthy of consideration than records held on paper. This issue is addressed in Chapter 6 - Electronic Records Management Systems.

5.2.7 In order to facilitate the review of records each business unit must establish a **Disposal Schedule**. The procedure to be followed is outlined below.

5.3 The Disposal Schedule

5.3.1 The registered files (or other types of record) held by a business unit will often span a wide variety of subjects. While some may deal with matters of major significance, others will deal with more routine matters.

5.3.2 The Disposal Schedule will help each business unit to identify, where possible, an appropriate length of time for which each file (or other type of record) should be kept and how it should ultimately be disposed of. Disposal may be to DG Info-Records with a recommendation that the file warrants permanent preservation, or it may be through local destruction.

5.3.3 As most records held by a business unit should be on registered files the **File List** (see Chapter 4, para 4.2) should be the basis of the Disposal Schedule.

5.3.4 Each file will contain records which fall into one of the following categories:

- records which merit consideration by DG Info-Records for permanent preservation;
- records which though not worthy of permanent preservation will need to be kept for an extended period for administrative purposes (perhaps for legal or contractual purposes);
- records which have only short term value and will not need to be retained for a lengthy period.

5.3.5 Where a file contains records which fall into more than one category it must be treated in accordance with the most important category.

5.3.6 Establishing a Disposal Schedule involves considering the existing open files held by the business unit and identifying, where possible, the category each file (or group of files) falls into. Having done that, a recommendation can then be made about the file's disposal.

5.3.7 The different types of information held within any particular business unit might include:

- **Administrative Records** – These records are produced in large volumes. Generally they have low retention values and are usually disposed of within 1 to 7 years after the date of creation.
- **Case Records** – The retention periods for these records are usually defined by an individual's age and life span unless a statutory or a long-term operational requirement defines a period for their continued retention. For example, records relating to criminal cases may be retained for 75 years or more.
- **Command and Control and Operational Records** – Some records in these categories can have a long life span and should, in many cases, be considered for permanent preservation.
- **Estates and Accommodation Records** – These records include a substantial amount of administrative type records with a low retention value, however certain records may be retained for much longer periods. For example:
 - Legal records – estate title, leasehold documentation, etc., should be retained for at least the occupancy period.
 - Policy records – surveys, policy studies etc., retention varies between 10 to 25 years but there may be records relating to important aspects such as disposal of potentially hazardous substances on sites or other health and safety issues that should be kept for much longer periods of time.

- **Finance Records** – These records normally have a short working life of about two years. Generally there is no legal requirement to retain these records beyond seven years.
- **Health and Safety Records** – As well as some statutory requirements that need to be complied with, there are those records that can have a very long retention requirement. Especially in cases involving exposure to radiation or contamination where the safety implications as a result of the contamination may only arise decades after the initial event. A retention period of up to 100 years may be required in these cases.
- **Personnel Records** – The retention periods for these records may vary but some should be kept for very long periods. Examples include:
 - Documents that have a bearing on pension entitlement should be kept for up to 100 years from date of birth.
 - Military Service personnel appraisal reports are to be kept for 100 years.
 - Civilian Staff appraisal records are normally kept as separate sub-sets of personal files. If kept in annual sets, they should be destroyed on a rolling basis.
 - Medical records are normally filed as a separate sub-set of individual personal files to allow for separate retention. In some instances where they relate to, for example, exposure to radiation, these may be kept for up to 100 years.
- **Policy Records** – These are normally retained for at least 25 years, and in cases where the records relate to the development of primary legislation, may be marked for permanent preservation.
- **Scientific, Technical and Research Records** – Records of the more important aspects of scientific, technological or medical research and development are normally retained as a long term research resource for other scientific researchers. Retention periods may differ, as some business units may retain these records as part of their permanent library, whilst others may consider them as case files and dispense with them after 10 years. Reports for these types of records are normally preserved, whilst the supporting information is not, however their administrative value could be long, i.e. Porton Down and paper records covering the volunteer programme go back to the 1950's.
- **Transaction Records** – These records record specific events that have a finite life, i.e. the award of a contract allocated to a named contractor to commission a particular task. Depending on the nature of the transaction, the retention period may vary between 6 to 25 years.

5.3.8 The varying management requirements for each of the types of information listed above also need to be considered. Factors to be considered include:

- Operational requirements.
- Business requirements.
- MOD corporate requirements.
- Public access requirements.
- Legal and statutory requirements.

- Human life expectancy.
- Volume of records likely to be generated.
- Sensitivity.
- Accessibility.

5.3.9 That recommendation should then be noted in the Disposal Schedule. An example of an extract of a completed Disposal Schedule is at Annex B.

5.3.10 In addition to the file list the "Record of Unregistered Material" (see Chapter 4, para 4.21.2) should also be considered and appropriate recommendations made, where possible.

5.3.11 The Branch Records Officer (see Chapter 3, para 3.2) is responsible for drawing up the Disposal Schedule. However, the task of recommending suitable retention periods for each file is best performed by the desk officers who use the files. They should be best placed to make this judgement based on their working knowledge of the nature of the file and its content. The Records Officer's role is to co-ordinate this task.

5.3.12 It may not be possible to make a recommendation about the disposal of every file. However, it is important to make a recommendation wherever possible. Remember that the records officer/ desk officer who will ultimately be required to make a decision about the disposal of each file may not have a detailed knowledge of the file's content because it may be up to 5 years since the file was opened and it may not have been used recently.

5.3.13 The records officer/desk officer who ultimately completes the Registered File Disposal Form (**MOD Form 262F**) may not agree with the recommendation and is free to change it. This might be necessary if subsequent events have given a different weight to the content of the file. However, where this is not the case, the recommendation can be endorsed with the confidence that it was the considered opinion of a predecessor who was familiar with the nature of the contents of the file.

5.3.14 Where it is not possible to make a recommendation about the disposal of a file the words "No Recommendation" should be entered on the Disposal Schedule. Such files are not to be weeded (see Chapter 4, Annex D, para (iv)).

5.4 Maintaining the Disposal Schedule

5.4.1 The recommendations noted in the Disposal Schedule will be made primarily on the basis of the type of information contained within the current part of the file. In many cases the recommendation will remain valid even when the existing file is closed and a new part opened. For instance, if a file has been recommended for passage to DG Info-Records because it illustrates significant developments in an area of policy, it is quite likely that any subsequent part of that file will fall into the same category. Equally if a file contains information which can be destroyed locally after a relatively short period this is also likely to apply to any subsequent part.

5.4.2 It may, however, be that subsequent parts of a file increase or diminish in importance in relation to previous parts. Where this is the case the desk officer should advise the records officer to amend the Disposal Schedule accordingly.

5.4.3 The revised recommendation will not necessarily mean that any previous parts of the file which were recommended for disposal in a different way were dealt with incorrectly, but see para 5.5.4.

5.4.4 The records officer is responsible for the maintenance of an up to date Disposal Schedule and the incorporation of amendments. The records officer is also responsible for ensuring that all desk officers have access to a copy of the schedule.

5.4.5 As new files (as opposed to new parts of existing files) are opened the records officer should establish whether an initial recommendation about disposal can be made. This will depend upon the nature of the file. It may be clear from the outset that the file will contain significant papers or, conversely, that the file is unlikely to contain records which will need to be retained for a lengthy period. If so a suitable recommendation can be made. If this is not possible the Disposal Schedule should be annotated to show that no recommendation has yet been made.

5.4.6 A copy of the Disposal Schedule is to be forwarded to DG Info-Records³ for reference purposes. It is not necessary to forward details of each amendment but an up to date version, or confirmation that no change has occurred, should be forwarded annually.

5.5 Timing of Review and Use of the Disposal Schedule

5.5.1 Chapter 4 (para 4.17) outlines the factors which determine when a registered file should be closed and the action to be taken at that time.

5.5.2 When a file is closed a Registered File Disposal Form (**MOD Form 262F**) is to be raised and placed in the file in accordance with the instructions in Chapter 4, para 4.18. At that time the Disposal Schedule is to be consulted to determine what recommendation has been made about the appropriate retention period and method of disposal. The disposal schedule recommendation should be noted in section I of the 262F and the file should then be passed to the desk officer responsible for reviewing it and completing the remainder of the form.

5.5.3 The desk officer responsible for carrying out the review must then consider the recommendation at section I of the 262F and either endorse or amend it. Before doing so the file minute sheet should be checked to see whether details of any significant enclosures have been recorded (see Chapter 4, para 4.9.1).

5.5.5 The 262F should then be completed and signed by an officer of at least HEO (or equivalent) grade (where necessary the desk officer must arrange for the form to be signed by the records officer or a line manager). If the ultimate recommendation is that the file should be retained for an extended period for administrative purposes, or that the file warrants permanent preservation, the specific enclosures which justify that recommendation (which should be identified on the file minute sheet) should be recorded on the 262F. If there are a large number of enclosures which justify such a recommendation only the key enclosures need be identified.

5.5.8 Unregistered records are to be reviewed within 4 years of their creation to determine the appropriate method of disposal. Any such records which merit consideration by DG Info-Records for permanent preservation should be forwarded in accordance with the instructions at para 5.7 and in Chapter 8.

5.5.9 An Aide Memoir outlining the review process is at Annex 5D. A diagram depicting the life-cycle of an open file is at Annex 5E and a diagram depicting the life-cycle of a closed file is at Annex 5F.

5.6 Existing Files Which Were Not Reviewed at Time of Closure

5.6.1 The policy governing the timing of file review was revised in August 1999 and promulgated in DCI Gen 220/99 dated 6/8/99. Prior to the introduction of the revised policy, files could be retained

for up to 4 years before review and completion of the Registered File Disposal Form (MOD Form 262F). The revised policy on the timing of file review does not apply retrospectively however, consideration should be given to accelerating the review of closed files which have not yet been reviewed. **It is recommended that all such files are now reviewed, and sections 2 and 3 of MOD form 262F completed, at the earliest opportunity.**

5.6.2 With the exception of files identified at para 5.6.1 above, business units holding registered files (or unregistered records) which have not been reviewed in accordance with the instructions are para 5.5 must take remedial action to deal with the review backlog. Registered File Disposal Forms (MOD Form 262F) should be raised for these files at the earliest opportunity. The files should then be reviewed and disposed of accordingly. It is likely that many such files will have no further administrative value and will not have historical value. Such files should be destroyed locally (but see para 5.11).

5.7 Retention of Registered Files within the Business Unit

5.7.1 If the completed and signed Registered File Disposal Form (MOD Form 262F) recommends that the file should be considered by DG Info-Records for permanent preservation it should normally be sent to DG Info-Records within 5 years of its closure. Files which also have ongoing administrative value may be retained locally for an extended period and should be forwarded to DG Info-Records when they are no longer needed. **However, DG Info-Records must be advised in writing of any case in which the file is still required by the business unit for administrative purposes 25 years after closure.**

5.7.2 If the 262F recommends that the file can be destroyed locally it may be retained by the business unit for up to 25 years after its closure. **If the file has not been destroyed within 25 years of its closure permission must be sought from DG Info-Records to retain it.**

5.7.3 Files which are to be retained for an extended period for administrative purposes but which are not considered to merit permanent preservation may be forwarded to DG Info-Records for storage if there is insufficient storage space locally. In these circumstances the records officer must ensure that explicit reasons are given on the 262F for the ongoing retention of the file, in line with the instructions at paras 5.5.4 and 5.5.5. **Failure to do so may result in the file being destroyed by DG Info-Records.**

5.8 Retention of Other Records

5.8.1 Unregistered records which merit consideration by DG Info-Records for permanent preservation are to be forwarded within 25 years of their creation, in accordance with the instructions in Chapter 8. DG Info-Records must be advised in writing of any case in which such records are still required by the business unit for administrative purposes 25 years after closure.

5.8.2 Unregistered records required for administrative purposes may be retained by the business unit for up to 25 years after their creation. If the records have not been destroyed within 25 years permission must be sought from DG Info-Records to retain them.

5.8.3 Unregistered records which are to be retained for an extended period for administrative purposes may, by prior arrangement, be forwarded to DG Info-Records² for storage if there is insufficient storage space within the business unit.

5.9 The Registered File Disposal Form (MOD Form 262F)

5.9.1 When a file is destroyed by the business unit the Registered File Disposal Form is to be

removed and used to replace the Registered File Record Sheet (MOD Form 262A) which should then be destroyed.

5.9.2 If the file is not destroyed locally but is forwarded to DG Info-Records the original 262F must accompany the file. The business unit should retain a copy of the 262F, annotate it to indicate that the file has been forwarded to DG Info-Records and use it to replace the 262A which should be destroyed.

5.9.3 The Registered File Record Sheet (**MOD Form 262A**) and Registered File Disposal Form (**MOD Form 262F**) are the definitive record of a file's existence and subsequent destruction/passage to DG Info-Records. MOD Form 262A must not be destroyed until replaced by MOD Form 262F. Each 262F must be retained for a period of not less than 30 years from the date of last enclosure (as recorded on the form). As MOD Form 262Fs are normally retained in a binder relating to a file series or a number of file series the binder should normally be retained for a period of not less than 30 years following the insertion of the final 262F. If a business unit is disbanded during this period the binder (s) should pass to the successor business unit. If there is no successor business unit the binder(s) should be forwarded to DG Info-Records² at Hayes.

5.9.4 An example of a Registered File Disposal Form and instructions on its completion are at Annex C.

5.10 Sponsors of Manuals and Books of Reference

5.10.1 Sponsors of books of reference, manuals, directories, etc are to ensure that a copy of the material is forwarded to DG Info-Records for consideration for permanent preservation. Sponsors are to maintain an unamended copy of each publication together with loose copies of each amendment for this purpose. Such material should be forwarded to DG Info-Records² in accordance with the instructions in Chapter 8.

5.11 Destruction of Top Secret Registered Files and Files Containing Codeword Material

5.11.1 All registered files containing Top Secret and/or codeword material are to be forwarded to DG Info-Records in accordance with the instructions in Chapter 8, even if the Registered File Disposal Form recommends that the file should be destroyed.

We have had a number of recent enquiries about the contents of the UFO files held by the Ministry of Defence, and I thought it would be useful if I put you in the picture on what we hold.

Our files are made up of UFO sighting reports, together with enquiries about other aspects of the UFO phenomenon, and the position of the Ministry of Defence. Virtually all of the UFO sighting reports we receive relate to lights or discs in the sky, or various ill-defined shapes or objects. In my time here I have not received a single report of any close encounter, but we have, in the past, received a very small number of letters that might fall into the category of a close encounter of the third or fourth kind. I recently had a request from a researcher to release these reports. As we receive so few, and recognising their value to researchers, I agreed that these reports could be released. I also said that I would make this material available to those UFO groups that we refer witnesses and enthusiasts to, and I therefore attach this for your information. As is usual when releasing UFO reports, I have deleted information relating to the identity of the witnesses, together with other personal information. I draw no conclusions from this material, and remain open-minded as to what may have prompted these five reports. I have not included material relating to reports that are already in the public domain, such as photocopied extracts from books such as "Above Top Secret".

I will keep you informed about any such cases in the future, and - as usual - will encourage any witness to get in touch with you. I remain of the opinion, however, that reports of close encounters are more likely to be reported to organisations such as yours than to us.

More generally, we are able to answer specific queries you may have about particular sightings which have occurred recently, and can let you know whether we have a report on the incident, and if so, what it contains. We will also do our best to answer any specific questions we are asked, and can also give general information about our files, and what they contain. However, the files that we hold only go back to 1985, with previous files having been "archived", and sent to the Public Record Office. Because these files are covered by the "30 year rule", and as, prior to 1967, UFO files were destroyed after five years, files held in this office are likely to be the only accessible UFO files at present.

I hope this is helpful.

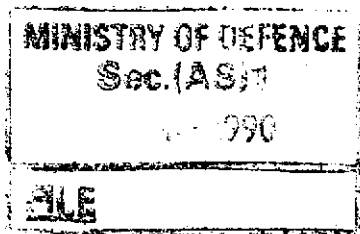

Your first reaction to this letter will be one of pure disbelief however, let me assure you I am neither insane or a charlatan as the facts will prove.

During W.W.2., as I am sure you are aware, a crashed U.F.O. was recovered by the military somewhere in this country. I should like to know the exact date and location of this event?

It is possible this was Pusslock Warren the location of which I am as yet unable to discover. Whilst my body lay in the U.F.O. I was taken into the Spectra computer. That was a strange experience.

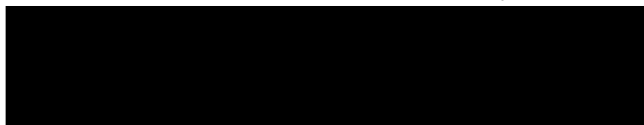
The parents of my present body were chosen in 1940. They saw a rocket shaped U.F.O. trailing a blue flame, and experienced a strange stillness.

Although Spectra rule me they will not tell me why I am here.

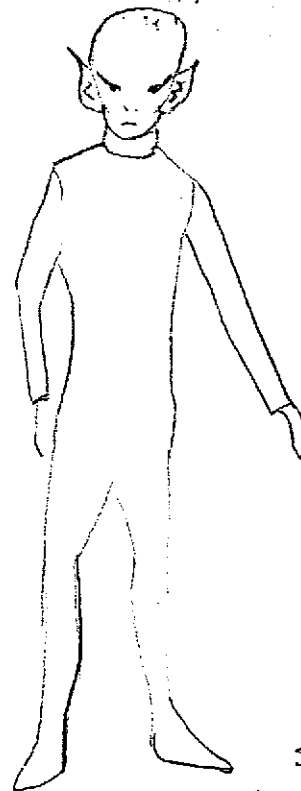
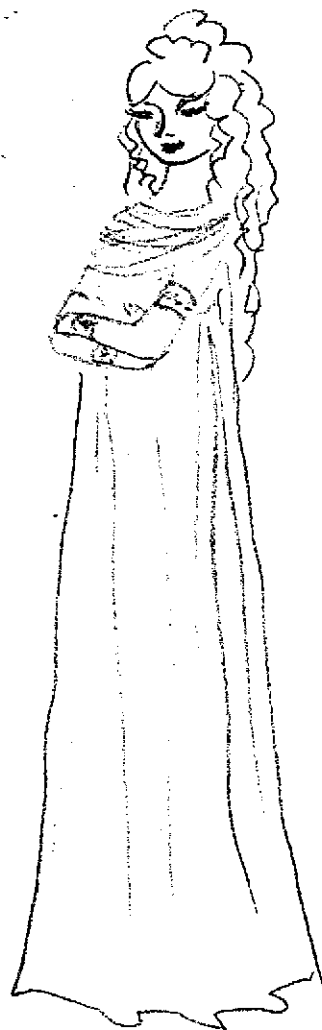

Dear Sir

Moving to the Welsh Valle Crucis Abbey scene you will see in the big tree next to the abbey one a lot of "Birds", yet again. And close up faces in the trees. In white, near the bay hanging down is what on first sight looks like a rippled rubber mat ending in a blob. It's head. This is the other side of their body obviously, their tail becoming a claw to keep them in position.

On the Bickston scene it looks like two tails in motion. This is probably due to the camera shutter speed which was a fixed focus one. So I couldn't improve it.

Dear Sir / Madam,

It has taken me a long time to decide to write to you. I am also quite convinced that after you have read this letter, you will probably throw it into the dustbin and have a good laugh at it. But I will go on anyway. I have tried so many times to put pen to paper and write in such a way that I will not be made to look a fool. I've thrown away so many letters that I have begun. This one is going, I've finally decided.

Here goes. On my way back from Southport after visiting a sick Aunt. My Mother and myself were heading towards Manchester. We both noticed a bright light. I will not go into great detail about what the light did. but the culmination was that our vehicle was slowed down by an odd looking black type 1930's car that was in front of ours. The driver was tall, stocky, and wearing a strange german type hat, even though his vehicle was dangerously close to ours not once did he show any movement or show any sign of movement. My car was slowed down by this vehicle in front from 65 MPH to almost a standstill. Both my Mother and I felt that something was very wrong and odd about the whole thing. I decided to open my window and look out. To my horror. Above my car was an unusually shaped craft of some kind, about 30 feet above us. The lights on this object were huge and very dazzling. The size of the thing was roughly about the size of a double decker bus on its side twice. The strangest thing though was that (Here comes the hard bit). We both felt as though time had stood still and it was very frightening indeed. We felt nothing, heard nothing, smelled nothing. It was as though we were dead, or not there. I remember hitting my head on something, probably the window of the car and I screamed, and suddenly the car that was in front of us disappeared and so did this odd craft. We drove like crazy.

to a petrol station and stopped. We didn't need petrol. We just wanted to get off the road. The object wasn't in sight at first and then it was suddenly there again in full view. I must say it was a beautiful thing all lit up we did notice a sort of dome amidst the lights. But we were very scared indeed. My car was back to normal by now. whilst the object was above us all the lights on the car (my car) went haywire. and I could smell a sweet burning some sort of odd smell.

When I dropped my Mother off home and finally got home myself. My husband was distraught. He thought we had had an accident. We left Southport at 7 o'clock evening and I arrived home at 10.30 evening. The first thing my husband said was where is your coat you look freezing. It should have taken us just over an hour to get back from Southport to Manchester. Just after I arrived home I had blue marks on both sides of my thigh and I was very very sick for a couple of days and also I had some terrible dreams which I would not like to go into on paper.

We worked it out that 55 minutes went missing in our time home and that dream that I had about an (teen Seey) a being that was 6 feet tall, maybe taller. Blue eyes and white shoulder length hair who wore a one piece silver or white suit with no pockets or anything. He said in my dream, that he had seen me when I was thirteen years old and no matter where I go he would know where to find me, and if it was necessary he would find me. I am now thirty eight years of age. The incident I am writing about only happened a few years ago. I am frightened and I do definitely believe that something is going to happen again. I can't talk to anyone about this because I don't think most people would believe me. But I swear to god it happened. There is so much more involved that I could not put pen to paper and discuss.

Please I would be so grateful indeed if you could help me to solve or at least explain to me what happened on that road. And why it happened to me and my Mum. I am a happily married woman who holds down

a small business I am told I am reliable, intelligent and trustworthy. I have read so much about UFO's since the sighting and I get the feeling that most people who have a visit from these crafts are either crazy or attention seekers. All I can do is speak for myself and my Mother. Believe me, I have heard the chance of the story being plastered all over the newspapers. The Mirror tried to con me into selling the story as so did Woman's World. But I did and do not want publicity. All I want to know is why they, the people on that craft, wanted or needed to contact me. I am totally confused. I understand that you have all your red tape and such to consider. I also expect you to reply to me in such a way that you will almost certainly make me out to be a fool. Well I'm not a fool and neither is my Mother. We both know a great deal about the incident and we are willing to tell you all we know, if you are willing to listen. But in return I want some long overdue answers.

One thing that does bother both my Mother and myself was not so long after the incident on the East London Road, My Mother was walking home from shopping and it was daylight. Her attention was caught by a bright light which flashed her three times then disappeared. Six miles away at the same time we found out later, the same light which was enormous, did the same to me as I was driving home with a friend. It's all so strange.

If I don't get any help or advice from you I really don't know what to do next. Because I have a gut feeling that we have not seen the back of this odd craft or the occupants.

Please take this letter seriously, because we need you to. I have never written to anyone about all this. I think it is about time something should be done or at least discussed.

I am writing in response to the letter received, dated 9 March 1982. As my information can no longer be considered as classified, I am now able to pass it onto you.

The letter that I sent to you, was only a small fraction, of the work that I had done on U.F.O. research. I was in fact in physical and psychic contact with an E.T. called Algar; whom I have had a relationship with since 1958, and it continued until 1981, when he was killed by another race of beings.

So to start at the beginning. I was seven years old, when I first saw traces left by a U.F.O. At the time I lived at [REDACTED] Glasgow. One Saturday, morning I had the impression that I should go out to the back, so much it was like an obsession(DIA 1). When I did go to the back, I found three indentations in the ground, they were in triangular formation. Each indentation was the same distance from it's partner, and they gave the impression that three large ball bearings had been dropped there. My first thought was that it was a U.F.O.; but I had never ever heard of U.F.O. or flying saucers, and yet the thought seemed normal to me, as if I used it on a regular basis. I told my father, who was rather quick at ridiculing and poo-pooing what I had told him. Anyway, a couple of months later, the first visit came from E.T.s, which was followed by a few more. They were of green gas which solidified when it came in from the passage way, which led to the toilet under, the door, and the wardrobe, which was situated against the door preventing it from opening. (DIA 2). There was one which was green and very large. that had eyes all over it, this one came three times. Then there was a woman with very sharp features, and what looked like fat worms sticking out of her head, where the hair should be. The last visit from the large green thing happened when my father tried to get into the bedroom, as usual I was against the door, with fear. My father was at the time, fairly atheletic and no weakling, but no matter how hard he pushed he could not get the door open; not until the large green thing had gone.

In 1959, I found semi-transparent, slug like creatures crawling up the wall on the opposite side of the back. At this period of time I was in with a band, especially, the lead singer [REDACTED] and the drummer [REDACTED] both of them saw the creatures. The end product of this was that we armed ourselves and started to shoot them, we used .22 air rifles at a range of fifty to seventy five yards. When we did kill them, they fell off the wall and took on the appearance of cement that had got damp and solidified. Quite often they would fall and appear to go through the ground leaving no trace at all. One day we found that we were unable to hit our targets, and we could see our shots pass through the targets, by the ricochets off the wall, and after that we found that it was a waste of time trying to shoot them, so we gave up as a bad job. (DIA 3).

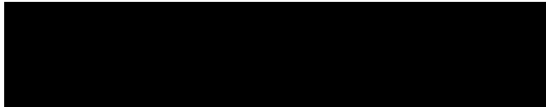
I was stationed at Keogh Barracks - Sept. 1968 April 1969 - when I was in the R.A.M.C., and Algar was with me then, even in spite of other E.T.s going away. A strong bond was forming of friendship and trust. One incident involves telepathic contact, and that occurred, following an incident when I was unusually indecisive. It was when I was on guard duty, and I was asked if I would like the first tour, to which I normally said yes, but thank God I eventually declined, for the first one was critically injured with the sick elf he was carrying. It was on the basis of safety, that we were to go in pairs from then on, and it was under these conditions that I got a telepathic link with Algar. We were returning to the guard house after our patrol, and to our right was a field, which had lighting only on the road on which we were walking. Apart from the lighting mentioned, the field was totally dark. I heard only what I can describe as a whisper, and it was saying that someone was creeping about in the field, to the front and slightly right. I immediately looked in that direction but saw nothing. But as I had heard this whisper several times before, and it had proved accurate, I decided to follow it through. I sent my partner around the camp museum, which was situated about twenty yards behind us; and I went to a lamp, and prepared to go into the field. It was at this point, when someone came out of the dark. I then called my partner and after a few heated words, I convinced the stranger who had no i.d. on him, to accompany us to the guard house. (DIA 4).

The real work began in May, 1979, when my wife and I formed a team, and together we collected such data as:- what the different coloured lights on a U.F.O. means, how they manage to evade radar, what fuel they use and what it looks like, I have been to their bases which were in Wirral and Cheshire. There was a curious incident which took place over the river Mersey, by the Wallasey Town Hall. There were six U.F.O.s flying at speed up and down the river, when I noticed a black one was trying to manoeuvre the other six. Unfortunately, the black one was shot down, it hit the water in front of the Town Hall. As I was watching, the front end of the U.F.O. hit the water, then the whole U.F.O. disappeared; leaving the water to splash, as if done by an invisible entity.

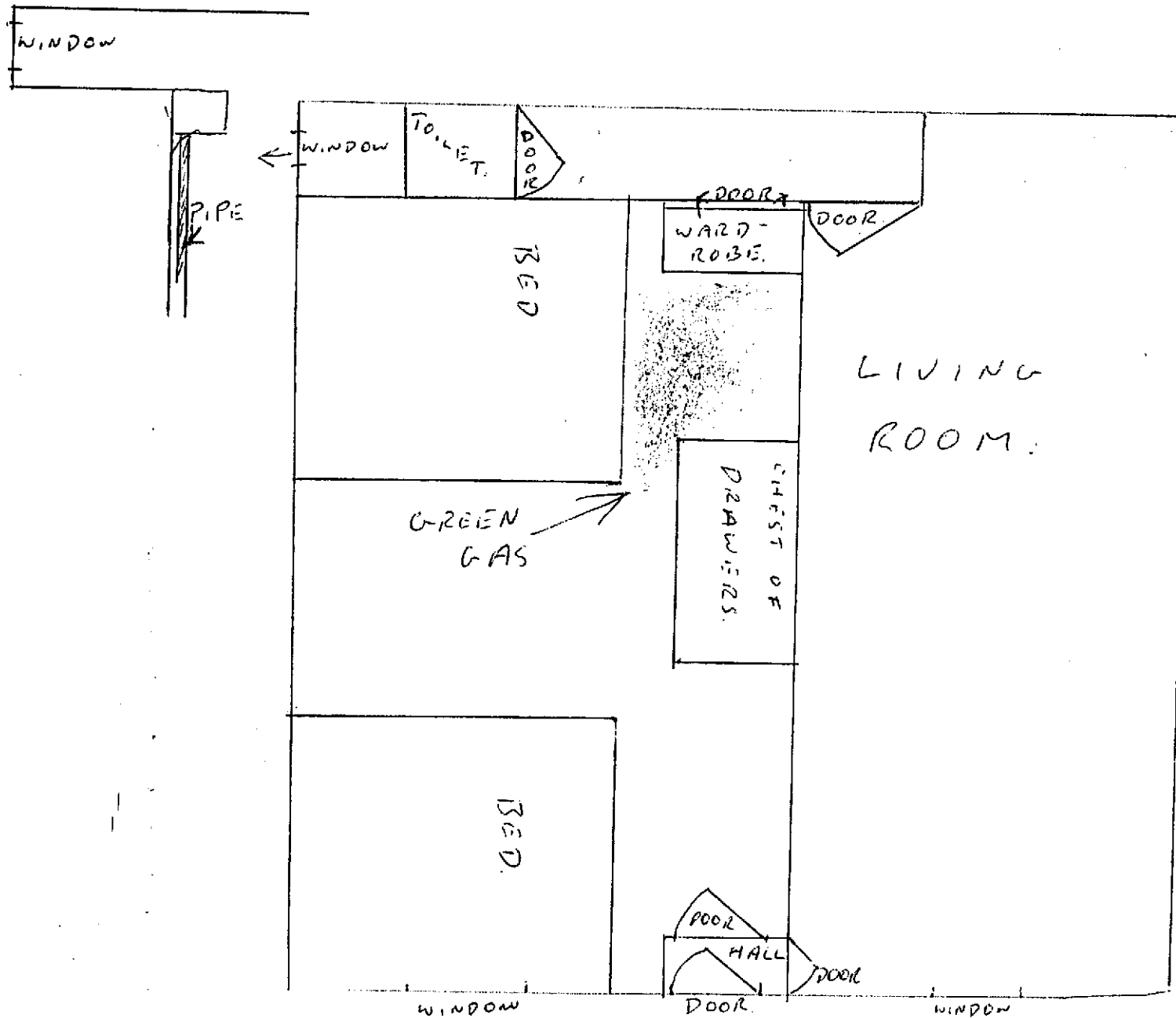
In June, 1981, Algar, was ready to approach the government in person. I was over the moon with pride to be used as the medium between alien race and our own race. Unfortunately, another race of E.T. decided to attack Algar, and his team of scientists, and killed Algar and several members of his team. That of course was that. It was not until October, 24 1981, that they sent some one to dominate me by using threats, and eventually attacking me, the E.T. died during his attack on me. Since there have been four responses to my telepathic messages sent out, but two of those contacts have been lost. But of the two who are still in contact, one is a woman, but I am unable to give you her name. The other is a male and his name is Malben, he says he comes from the Milky Way, and that his planet is called Platone.

I am intending to make contacts strong, and hopefully make a meeting between the alien race and our Government, with the information that I have now given you, I hope that you would reconsider sponsoring my research. The information that I have given you is accurate and truthful. Although there is lots more. I decided to give you what I thought was the most important to you.

IT WAS the week when John Redwood's earthly origins were called into doubt and Mr Spock's pointy ears were given away by the thousand.

So it will come as no surprise that one of Whitehall's finest has succumbed to the power of aliens.

Nick Pope headed the Secretariat (Air Staff) office, with a brief to deal with inquiries about flying saucers and other unexplained phenomena.

Mr Pope's conversion is likely to cause a sensation among committed ufologists.

Graham Birdsall, editor of UFO Magazine, said: 'I welcome the bravery of a man who must have experienced tremendous pressure from his superiors, but who stuck to his views.'

Nick is now firmly of the opinion that UFOs and the ETH (extraterrestrial hypothesis) are one of the same. He is still employed by the MoD, who are naturally feeling somewhat uneasy at his decision to speak out so publicly. 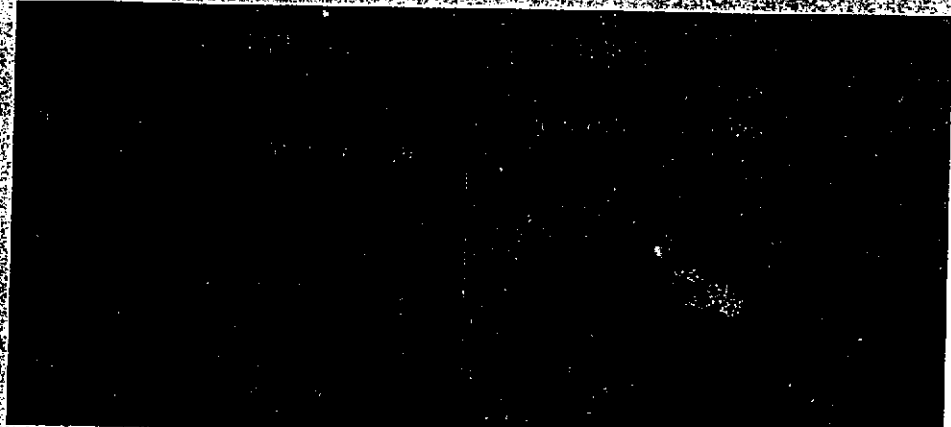

Scanners of the alien nation

DONT call me a fruitcake, but listen: on a warm summer's day at the age of eight, I lay on my back on the grassy playing fields, looked up and saw an unidentified flying object. A tiny triangular glint in the sky. My chums saw it, too. The local paper got wind and there was a little column, dripping sarcasm. The little green men were coming to take us kids away, jeer on, but I had seen something. What it was, who knows?

This event hovered back into my mind last week in a Whitehall wine bar while talking to the British Government's foremost expert on UFOs, Nick Pope is a civil servant who has spent four years analysing reports of sightings of Unidentified Flying Objects for the Ministry of Defence. He is a sane, cautious, bespectacled 29-year-old, 10 years at the MoD. He speaks in the carefully draughted idiom of the Whitehall memo, emphasising that his beliefs are personal, not those of the Secretary of State for Defence, Michael Portillo — himself rumoured not to be as other earthen.

From 1991 to 1994 I worked in the Secretariat (Air Staff) 2A. I was the MoD's UFO desk officer. I came into that job with an open mind. After having seen all the evidence and the expert testimony, I came out of that job believing that a very small percentage of what are commonly termed UFOs may well be extra-terrestrial in origin.

Had he ever seen a UFO, I asked him? 'No.'

I came clean about my experience. He looked at me, the unbeliever, with something approaching envy in his eyes.

The UFO Research Association hosts its eighth Congress on Saturday. It is sold out, and reports from the final frontier say business is better than ever.

Still at the MOD, but no longer on the UFO desk, Pope has suffered for his views. His nickname in the MOD is 'Spooky', that of Fox Mulder, a character in the cult TV series *X-Files*. When he walks along the corridor, fellow civil servants whistle the theme from Steven Spielberg's film, *Close Encounters of the Third Kind*. His chances of becoming a permanent under-secretary have dimmed. And yet: 'We received between 2,000 and 3,000 UFO reports each year. We knew this was the tip of the iceberg because most people didn't know how to report a UFO, that is who to contact, or they were afraid of the ridicule.'

Among those 2,000 to 3,000 reports we always figured that 95 per cent could be explained away in terms of known objects or phenomena. I know all the explanations: flocks of geese, aircraft lights, satellites, meteors, fireballs, ball lightning, lasers and searchlights reflecting off low cloud, hoaxes. There is still this 5 per cent that you can't explain, that defy explanation. His book on UFOs, provisionally entitled *Open Skies, Closed Minds*, will be published by Simon and Schuster in June 1996.

The absurdist comedy of the MOD's own UFO-watcher tumbling from sceptic to (qualified) believer speaks to the spooky-woo-woo spirit of the millennium. Now that God, who once wound our sundials, is thought to be dead, human awe has turned to UFO sightings and even alien abductions — in the jargon, *Close Encounters of the Fourth Kind*. Next weekend the British UFO Research Association will host its eighth International UFO Congress to discuss these and other UFO events. It is sold out. Later this month, Channel 4 will screen a controversial film of an alien autopsy, allegedly shot after the UFO crash at Roswell, New Mexico, in 1947.

Pope has seen the footage: 'I found it gruesome and unpleasant, but then I'd never seen an autopsy before. There were 100 people in the auditorium at the Museum of London. The atmosphere was jokey for a minute, but as the autopsy started and the humans cut up the aliens there was a lot of uneasy shuffling and muffled cries of "Oh, my God!"'

His Excellency denies the abduction. The old saw, Ocean's razor — 'No more things should be presumed to exist than are absolutely necessary' — slices up the little green men better than Channel 4's autopsy.

This is not to say that the people who report UFOs are bonkers. Ordinary people do witness such things as bright lights in the sky and should not be lightly mocked, so do military officers, who supply the best-authenticated cases. But there is a battery of good reasons explaining why UFO sightings and reported abductions — even Pope's 5 per cent — have more to do with the vagaries of the human mind than with aliens.

None of this is a match for the first law of storytelling: the exciting explanation will always drive out the boring.

First, bright lights in the sky. Psychologist Michael Persinger, of Canada's Laurentian University, has noted a big statistical correlation between flying saucer reports and earth tremors. He has speculated that electro-magnetic pulses, released by the shifting of the earth's tectonic plates, could stimulate images in the mind's eye — the brain's temporal lobe. This would also account for the cutting off of a car's electricity.

Professor Ashley Grossman of Bart's agrees: 'There is an increasing amount of evidence that electro-magnetic pulses can affect brain function. *In vitro* research suggests that there is some sort of sensory perception — you could call it a sixth sense — which some animals have. The brain works on electricity. It's rather like taking your credit card near a large magnet. If someone had a low threshold for temporal lobe epilepsy and seizures, an electro-magnetic pulse could fire off hallucinations.'

But temporal lobe epilepsy can be the first manifestation of a brain tumour. Prof Grossman warns: 'Anyone who sees a UFO or has a semi-mystical experience should have a brain scan. Of course, some experiences could be put down to hysteria. But there could be an underlying biological abnormality triggering the hallucinations.'

Looking back, visions of the Virgin could have been prompted by bio-abnormality. Joan of Arc famously took a long time to find lungs caused by tuberculosis. Had TB reached her brain, it could have triggered the visions. And never underestimate autosuggestion, the phenomenon which drove the Salem Witches and may be responsible for Peter de Cuetlar's 'imp'.

Second, Rendlesham. Let's presume Halt and the other Americans saw something in the sky, something which left a radioactive spoor in the forest. Why need it come from outer space? The Pentagon's ultra-secret Black Budget has been responsible for all sorts of weird lights in the sky, clocked by military men such as Halt who would not have been security-cleared for the programme. The post-Stearth bomber, Project Aurora, is currently whizzing around the world being mistaken for a UFO.

Third, Roswell. The UFO air crash is a bunch of horse puke, according to one sceptic, Irving 'Newt' Newton. What actually crashed in 1947 was another secret Pentagon wheeze, Project Mogul, a high altitude balloon checking for radiation from Soviet atomic bombs.

Fourth, the Channel 4 hoax. The curiously humanoid shape

of the aliens under the knife chimed with a line from Thomas Aquinas: 'Angels need an assumed body, not for themselves, but on our account.'

Anatomist Paul O'Higgins of University College, London, who has seen the film, says the aliens 'have our anatomy, plus a collection of relatively common anatomical anomalies: the six digits, the enlarged brain case which you get with hydrocephalus, distended abdomen, lack of umbilicus, membranes over the eyes — easy to do with plasticine. The chance that aliens would look like us by accident are remote.'

The writer Phillip Knightley famously objected, prior to its publication, to the Hitler Diaries hoax played on the *Sunday Times*. Knightley's memo is a classic of journalistic rigour. He asked: 'How thoroughly has the vendor explained where the diaries have been all these years and why they have surfaced now... The crux of the matter is that secrecy and speed work for the con man.'

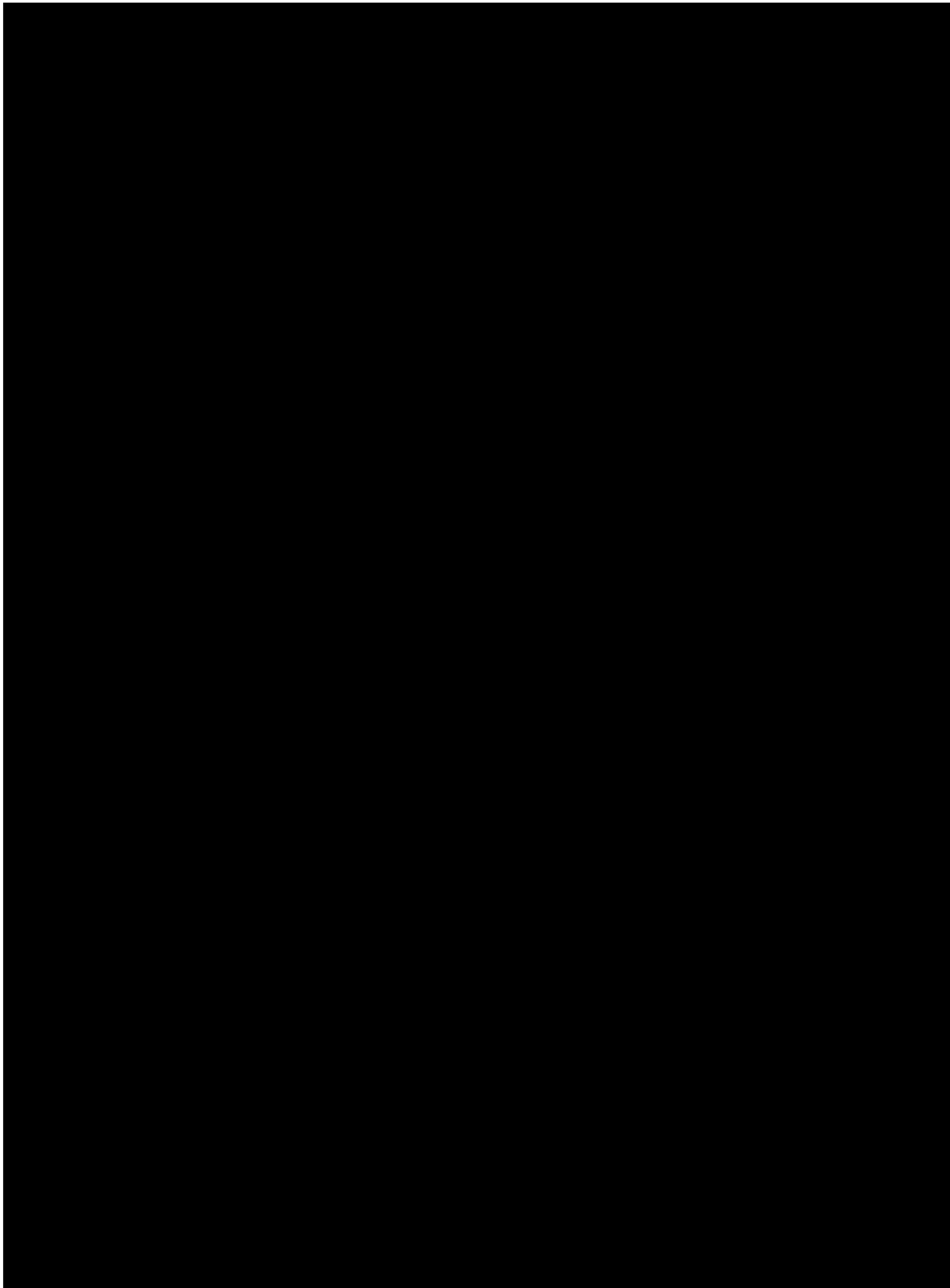
Thus far, Channel 4 has not released any verifiable detail on the origins of the film — bad scepticism but great showbiz. The *Observer* bets Channel 4 showman-in-chief Michael Grade a case of antipodean, H-bomb-free champagne the Roswell film will be proved to be a hoax before the year is out.

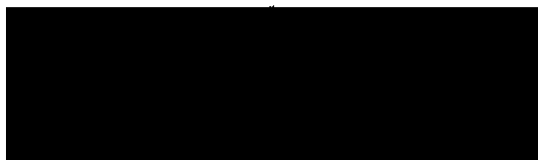
- A. To determine size of elliptical shaped object identified on supplied colour slide (not original).

1. Photogrammetry and Computer Modelling Flight were tasked to examine and if possible, photogrammetrically derive, dimensions of an object seen at night on a colour slide. This elliptical shaped object is clearly visible on the slide above and to the right of a large building.

2. To determine the size of an object from a photographic slide, apart from knowing the film format and focal length of the camera, certain other criteria must be available. These are either:-

- a. Known distance from the camera to the object (scale).
- b. Known scalar (distance) on the object.

3. Assuming the distance of the object to the camera is unknown and that there are no scalars to use on or close to the object it is evident there is insufficient data for the Flight to determine the size of the elliptical shaped object.



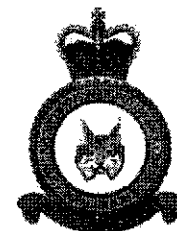

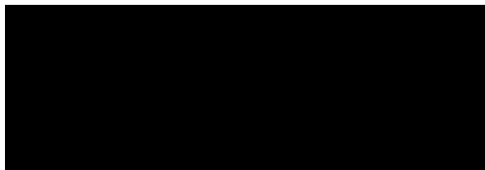
A scan was produced at 2,400dpi to enable us to investigate, at greater magnification the structure of the anomaly. From this several points were noted:

- h. There appeared to be no or little image movement across the frame, which would indicate a relatively fast exposure or the use of a tripod.
- i. There is no indication of specular reflection nor of lens flare.
- j. The illuminated plane of the object passes through the very center of the frame.

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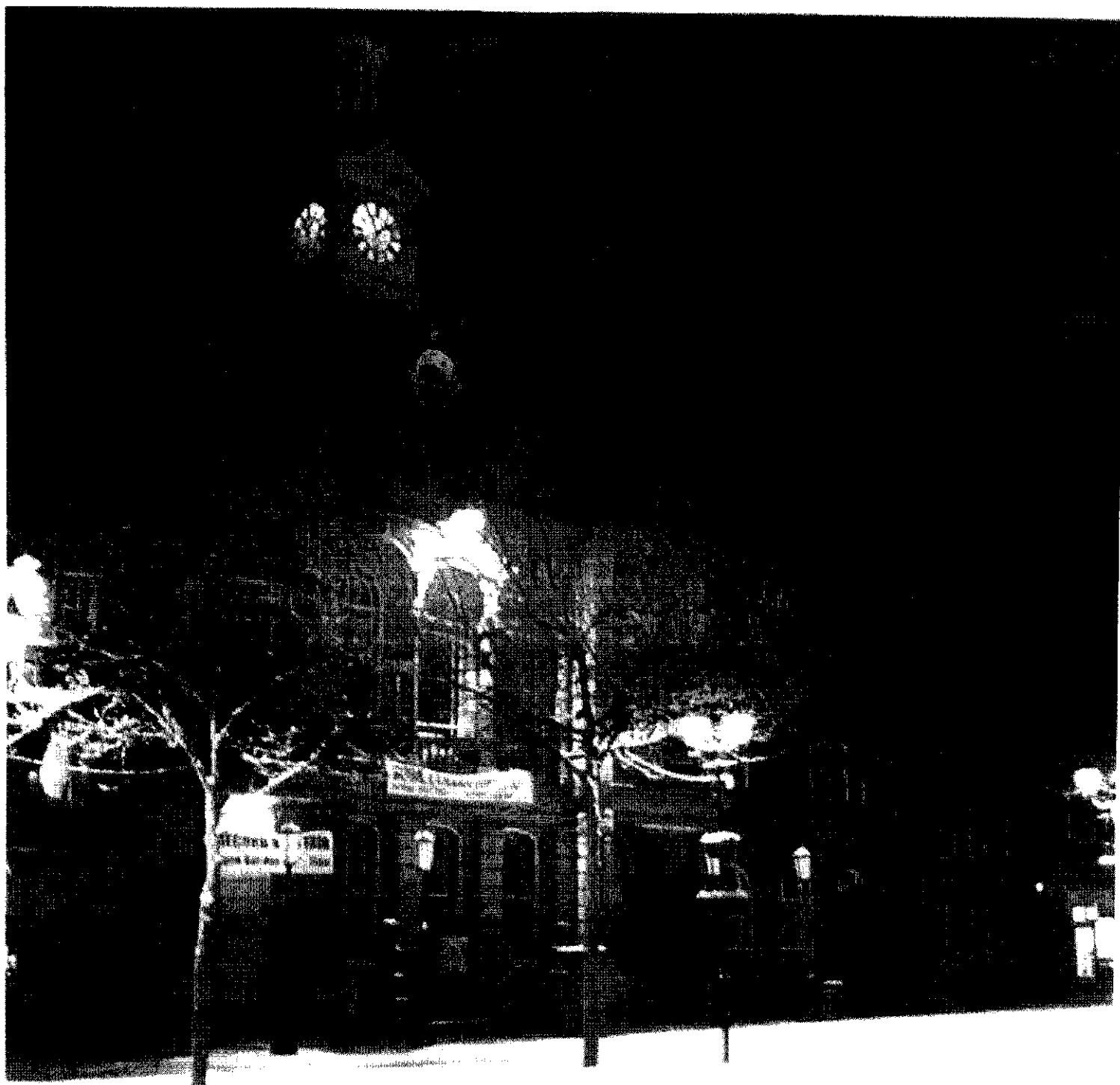

3. No definitive conclusions can be gathered from evidence submitted, however, it may be coincidental that the illuminated plane of the object passes through the center of the frame, indicating a possible lens anomaly e.g. a droplet of moisture.

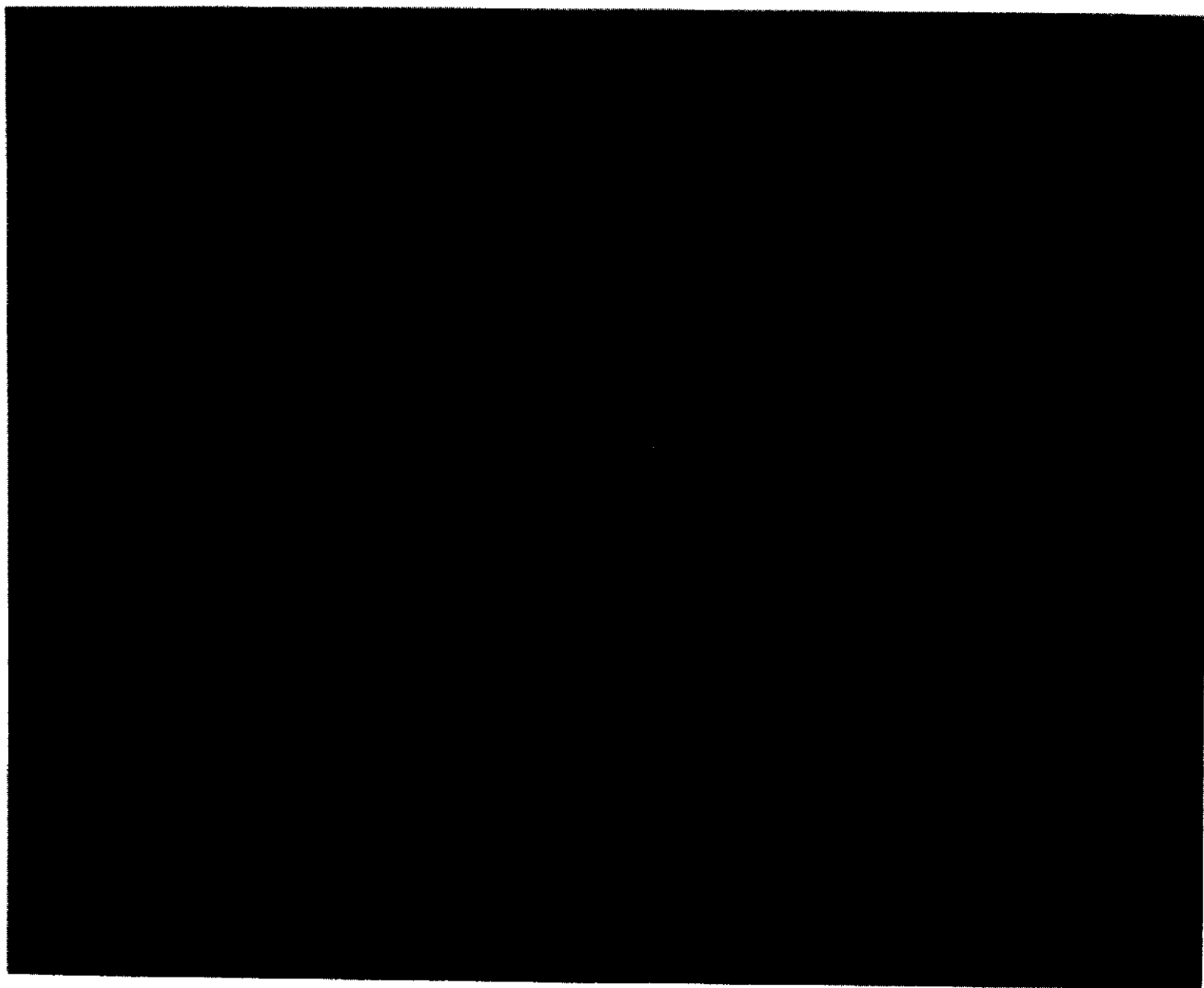

**UNIDENTIFIED FLYING OBJECTS – PROPOSED MEETING BETWEEN
RESEARCHERS AND MEMBERS OF DAS**

Issue

1. Members of DAS, with policy responsibility for the department's limited interest in Unidentified Flying Objects, have been asked to meet with two prominent researchers [REDACTED] who are studying the UFO phenomenon. 

Recommendation

2. That Minister notes that DAS staff intends to agree to the meeting, to be held on a date in May 2004.

Timing

3. Routine.

Background

4. [REDACTED] has been corresponding with DAS on the subject of UFOs since 1998. He states he was a founder member of the Independent UFO Network in 1987 and of the UFO Investigator's Network in 1999. He has also served as a Council member of the British UFO Research Association in the late 1980s. [REDACTED] was a journalist for ten years in the regional press and, in addition to his current studies, now works freelance. He has written (or co-written) eight books on UFOs, ghosts and legends and has contributed to a number of magazine articles and TV programmes on related subjects. He is currently a post-doctoral researcher [REDACTED] where he is studying the social history of the UFO phenomenon in Britain from 1947. He

is in the process of preparing an application to the Economic and Social Research Council for funding to undertake a two-year project to further his research.

5. [REDACTED] has also been corresponding with DAS on UFO matters since 2000. He works closely with [REDACTED] on a number of projects and has written, or contributed to seven books on UFOs, ghosts and legends (with [REDACTED] and others). [REDACTED] has produced articles for UFO magazines, local and national TV and radio shows.

6. Both [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] have made a large number of requests for information about our files relating to UFOs under the Code of Practice on Access to Government Information. They have indicated that they intend to continue to do so when the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (FOIA) comes into force on 1 January 2005. They have recently requested a meeting with members of DAS staff in order to avoid unnecessary correspondence in future. They have assured us that this meeting is for the purposes of their own research only.

7. Previous practice has not been to agree to such requests, which has possibly contributed to the perception by some groups that the Department is being secretive. The subject matter lends itself well to populist theories of government cover-ups, and appearances in the media by unofficial MOD spokesmen only highlights our reluctance to enter into debate. Rejection of the request could further increase the perceived secrecy surrounding the MOD position on this subject.

8. DAS staff believes that given the current climate of government openness, and forthcoming Freedom of Information Act, it would be beneficial for us to meet these two researchers. [REDACTED] 40 [REDACTED] appear to have some influence on the public debate of UFOs and a meeting could help them gain a better understanding of the department's limited interest in this subject. I would propose to meet them, together with the appropriate Desk Officer, sometime next month. In advance of the meeting we would seek details of the issues Messrs [REDACTED] 40 [REDACTED] 40 wish to discuss and the meeting, and we would emphasise that any information provided was being provided solely to assist with their research. We do not propose a more active engagement with UFO interest groups. D News RAF has been consulted and is content for this meeting to proceed.

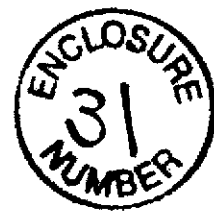

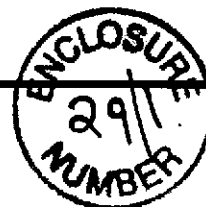

Probably best not to raise the possibility, but on 1 January 2005 this type of file is a likely candidate for a FOI request ie "Nick Pope" "UFO etc. Commercial confidentiality, personal sensitivity might, of course, be cited (post 1 Jan 2005) for grounds not to release info from it!

On to the task in hand - I suggest some changes to your para 2:

First sentence to stand, but sentence two onwards -

"With regard to the process for release of this file into the public domain, it might be helpful if I briefly explain that not all records created in the MOD are permanently preserved at The National Archives (TNA). Each business unit has the responsibility to review the records they hold and the authority to destroy locally those records which are not considered worthy of further administrative or have no perceived historical value. Records that are considered to have further value are transferred into the custody of the MOD's records department for review at the appropriate time. This particular file is a general administrative file and it is unlikely that when reviewed, it would be a candidate for permanent preservation at TNA."

Two suggested changes to the third para - there are two uses of the word "retained" where possible I suggest that the word "held" or similar be used. "Retained" has a particular meaning under the Public Records Act (however, it is generally the case that it is misused to no adverse effect!).

The Air Historical Branch (Publications Clearance Branch (Air)) holds records of Publications Clearance in temporary enclosure jackets which do not form part of the Air Historical Branch registered filing system. These may be considered for review 6 months after the last action but are usually held for around 2 years to ensure that all action is complete. They may be held for longer if authors submit further material for clearance when it is usual practice to link this with previous correspondence. In Mr Pope's case, he continued to write for publication and involve himself in media activities, so the relevant records have been held for a longer period. These include one file PCB(Air)3409 - Publications Clearance - "Open Skies, Closed Minds - Official Reactions To The UFO Phenomenon". However, no PCB(Air) file has ever been considered worthy of permanent preservation and all have ultimately been destroyed when they ceased to be of any administrative value.

Thank you for your letter dated 26 November in which you asked some questions regarding the papers relating to Mr Pope's book, "Open Skies, Closed Minds". The information you requested is as follows.

This branch (previously Secretariat (Air Staff)) hold one registered file, D/Sec(AS)20/4-Public Relations Clearances Part C, which contains 32 enclosures relating to Mr Pope's book. With regard to the normal process for release of this file to the general public, it might be helpful if I briefly explain that not all the records created in the MOD are permanently preserved for the National Archive. Each business unit has the authority to review the records they hold and, in most cases, destroy locally those records which are not considered worthy of permanent preservation. Records which do appear to merit permanent retention are forwarded to the MOD Information Records Department for consideration. This particular file is a general administration file and it is unlikely that when reviewed, it would merit permanent retention in the National Archive. Records can be retained in the business unit for a maximum of 25 years after the file was closed, so we would not expect this file to survive beyond 2020 at the latest.

The Air Historical Branch (Publications Clearance Branch) hold Publication Clearance material in temporary enclosure jackets which do not form part of the Air Historical Branch registered filing system. These are normally destroyed locally around 2 years after the last action was taken, but are sometimes retained for longer if authors write further material which is then linked to their earlier work. In Mr Pope's case, he cleared three further books through the Publications Clearance Branch and continues to be involved in media activities, so these records have been retained for a longer period than normal. These records are not released into the public domain, but are destroyed when they are no longer of any administrative value.

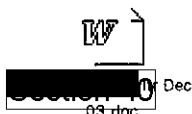

PCB(Air) files: Because of the personal nature of the subject matter, PCB(Air) files do not form part of AHB's Registered Filing System and are held and maintained solely by the PCB(Air) desk officer. Files are kept ostensibly as TEJs and none has ever been considered either for permanent preservation or release into the public domain. As TEJs, the files can be considered for local destruction at 6 months after the last action but it is PCB(Air) practice to destroy them around the 2 year mark to allow for any follow up action that may be necessary. For example, in Mr Pope's case we knew there were further books to come and therefore retained all the relevant paperwork. Further, we sometimes ask authors to confirm in writing that they accept the terms and conditions set out in the clearance letter and/or to let us know the publication details of the book.

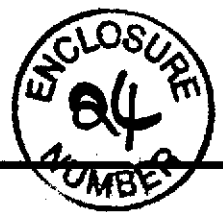

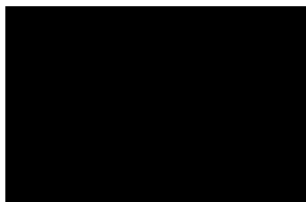

We have had a number of recent enquiries about the contents of the UFO files held by the Ministry of Defence, and I thought it would be useful if I put you in the picture on what we hold.

Our files are made up of UFO sighting reports, together with enquiries about other aspects of the UFO phenomenon, and the position of the Ministry of Defence. Virtually all of the UFO sighting reports we receive relate to lights or discs in the sky, or various ill-defined shapes or objects. In my time here I have not received a single report of any close encounter, but we have, in the past, received a very small number of letters that might fall into the category of a close encounter of the third or fourth kind. I recently had a request from a researcher to release these reports. As we receive so few, and recognising their value to researchers, I agreed that these reports could be released. I also said that I would make this material available to those UFO groups that we refer witnesses and enthusiasts to, and I therefore attach this for your information. As is usual when releasing UFO reports, I have deleted information relating to the identity of the witnesses, together with other personal information. I draw no conclusions from this material, and remain open-minded as to what may have prompted these five reports. I have not included material relating to reports that are already in the public domain, such as photocopied extracts from books such as "Above Top Secret".

I will keep you informed about any such cases in the future, and - as usual - will encourage any witness to get in touch with you. I remain of the opinion, however, that reports of close encounters are more likely to be reported to organisations such as yours than to us.

More generally, we are able to answer specific queries you may have about particular sightings which have occurred recently, and can let you know whether we have a report on the incident, and if so, what it contains. We will also do our best to answer any specific questions we are asked, and can also give general information about our files, and what they contain. However, the files that we hold only go back to 1985, with previous files having been "archived", and sent to the Public Record Office. Because these files are covered by the "30 year rule", and as, prior to 1967, UFO files were destroyed after five years, files held in this office are likely to be the only accessible UFO files at present.

Dear Sir / Madam,

It has taken me a long time to decide to write to you. I am also quite convinced that after you have read this letter, you will probably throw it into the dustbin and have a good laugh at it. But I will go on anyway. I have tried so many times to put pen to paper and write in such a way that I will not be made to look a fool. I've thrown away so many letters that I have begun. This one is going, I've finally decided.

Here goes. On my way back from Southport after visiting a sick Aunt My Mother and myself were heading towards Manchester. We both noticed a bright light. I will not go into great detail about what the light did. but the culmination was that our vehicle was slowed down by an odd looking black type 1930's car that was in front of ours. The driver was tall, stocky, and wearing a strange german type hat, even though his vehicle was dangerously close to ours not once did he show any movement or show any sign of movement. My car was slowed down by this vehicle in front from 65 MPH to almost a standstill. Both my Mother and I felt that something was very wrong and odd about the whole thing. I decided to open my window and look out. To my horror. Above my car was an unusually shaped craft of some kind, about 30 feet above us. The lights on this object were huge and very dazzling the size of the thing was roughly about the size of a double decker bus on its side twice. The strangest thing though was that (Here comes the hard bit). We both felt as though time had stood still and it was very frightening indeed. We felt nothing, heard nothing, smelled nothing. It was as though we were dead, or not here. I remember hitting my head on something, probably the window of the car and I screamed, and suddenly the car that was in front of us disappeared and so did this odd craft. We drove like crazy.

to a petrol station and stopped. We didn't need petrol. We just wanted to get off the road. The object wasn't in sight at first and then it was suddenly there again in full view. I must say it was a beautiful thing all lit up we did notice a sort of dome amidst the lights. But we were very scared indeed. My car was back to normal by now. whilst the object was above us all the lights in the car (my car) went haywire. and I could smell a sweet burning some sort of odd smell.

When I dropped my Mother off home and finally got home myself. My husband was distraught. He thought we had had an accident. We left Southport at 7 o'clock evening and I arrived home at 10.30 evening. The first thing my husband said was where is your coat you look freezing. It should have taken us just over an hour to get back from Southport to Manchester. Just after I arrived home I had blue marks on both sides of my thigh and I was very very sick for a couple of days and also I had some terrible dreams which I would not like to go into on paper.

We worked it out that 55 minutes went missing in our time home and that dream that I had about an (teen boy) a being that was 6 feet tall, maybe taller. Blue eyes and white shoulder length hair who wore a one piece silver or white suit with no pockets or anything. He said in my dream, that he had seen me when I was thirteen years old and no matter where I go he would know where to find me, and if it was necessary he would find me. I am now thirty eight years of age. The incident I am writing about only happened a few years ago. I am frightened and I do definitely believe that something is going to happen again. I can't talk to anyone about this because I don't think most people would believe me. But I swear to god it happened. There is so much more involved that I could not put pen to paper and discuss.

Please I would be so grateful indeed if you could help me to solve or at least explain to me what happened on that road. And why it happened to me and my Mum. I am a happily married woman who holds down

a small business. I am told I am reliable, intelligent and trustworthy. I have read so much about UFO's since the sighting and I get the feeling that most people who have a visit from these crafts are either crazy or attention seekers. All I can do is speak for myself and my Mother. Believe me, I have heard the chance of the story being plastered all over the newspapers. The Mirror tried to con me into selling the story as so did Womens World. But I did not do not want publicity. All I want to know is why they, the people on that craft, wanted or needed to contact me. I am totally confused. I understand that you have all your red tape and such to consider. I also expect you to reply to me in such a way that you will almost certainly make me out to be a fool. Well I'm not a fool and neither is my Mother. We both know a great deal about the incident and we are willing to tell you all we know, if you are willing to listen. But in return I want some long overdue answers.

One thing that does bother both my Mother and myself was not so long after the incident on the East London Road, My Mother was walking home from shopping and it was daylight. Her attention was caught by a bright light which flashed her three times then disappeared. Six miles away at the same time we found out later, the same light which was enormous, did the same to me as I was driving home with a friend. It's all so strange.

If I don't get any help or advice from you I really don't know what to do next. Because I have a gut feeling that we have not seen the last of this odd craft or the occupants.

Please take this letter seriously, because we need you too. I have never written to anyone about all this I think it is about time something should be done or at least discussed.

I believe for some years now I've had a 1st kind encounter which has gone on and on! They are as in the legend Serpents but a curious genetic mix of 3 species. Birds, snakes (cobra type) and man. I have been spending time in their company believing them to be a strange new 'Magpie'. I should say they communicate between themselves with a call like a bird, resembling one of our own raven or blackbird noises. They are here in peace and they've simply said 'hello' to both me and my daughter. They use telepathy and that's how they'll communicate with us. Please find a telepath who can send and receive as I can. I've been on 'Duty' 4 years already and need a rest.

I would reckon my phobia about snakes is getting in the way of my continuing with them. I can't control the shakes. They are strangely beautiful and immensely powerful. I would estimate their 'length' at least 20 feet plus. With the cranial capacity of the 3 species they evolved from. Their brain power is awesome! If they use all their full capacity. They have huge heads and can fly as birds can and in the manner of tree snakes too. They're just amazing! They mean no harm and I have no idea of their future intentions at this point. It would be crazy to show ARMS at any point. I believe they could wipe us out no problem if they wanted to. If the legends are true as they appear to be. The staff at the landing should use tinted goggles, as the landing region will be bathed in a strong glaring golden light. This explains the obsession the Peruvians and Mayas had with gold. Their scout craft produce the light. Light resembling strong sunlight at noon. Golden light! non radioactive! Now I'll explain my photos simply taken at locations generally full of tourists at the time except for the Bickston shot.

Firstly the one with the benches in the middle region is Thurstaston Country Park picnic area. Flying down are magpies. These are ours. Though the others appear I'm sure in the background as curled up heads apparently floating. This is a companion

picture only.

Then look first to the Briston shot. The number on the back is my [redacted] member's code! Ignore it. In the centre can be seen a "Bird" flying between trees. Notice if you will the tail especially, then look at our Maggie. Fascinating aren't they? The colour configuration is wrong too as you can plainly see. In the background of the Briston picture is a "craft" behind the trees with what could be rivets on! It's puzzled me for some time what it was till it dawned.

Moving to the Welsh Valle Crucis Abbey scene you will see in the big tree next to the abbey one a lot of "Birds", yet again. And close up faces in the trees. In white. Near the bay hanging down is what on first sight looks like a rippled rubber mat ending in a blob. It's head. This is the other side of their body obviously, their tail becoming a claw to keep her in position.

On the Briston scene it looks like two tails in motion. This is probably due to the camera shutter speed which was a fixed focus one, so I couldn't improve it.

I don't know why I was chosen for this. I think they've been the cause of some structure damage on the houses I've lived in. The roofs were ~~also~~ always losing slates and gutters coming loose. And leaks. They liked me so much they slept on the roof to be near me. Why they like me is an even bigger mystery. A scout ship does duty outside at night and does not attempt anymore to mimic stars in the sky. They are waiting for news. They are standing in the holding pattern as they say in aircraft circles!

Please hurry as they are becoming impatient to touch down.

Can you confirm they are UFO's over Perth Scotland. My sister lives there and is having roof problems too. She is also a telepath I think but doesn't realise it!

I know you know they are here. four battle cruiser the M12 was parked at Liverpool Pier then another ship took its place in February/March with better equipment on board. It's likely a white ship parked on the Welsh coast appearing to do "tourist" duty i.e. the public can walk on her sometimes, is part of that fleet. Would I be correct?

I forgot to say in this fleet is a body of them, at least fifty individuals well enough to fill 2 big trees anyway. There may be more than that.

You should behave as if they were a visiting royal party as they were treated by the Incas. Don't go over the top please. Don't destroy the peaceful work I have done for you.

You wonder why they choose an urban area this time round? I think they acted on a funny idea I had (before I knew them properly) after reading a Von Danke book. I wondered what it would be like if the 'gods' came back and used an opposite geographic place to Peru and instead of remote mountain why not smack in the centre of town. It's a joke in one respect. They understand human too.

I am not a crank, just an ordinary person. I would like my life to return to normal now, so would the aliens. I am not attention seeking, just trying to attract your attention on their behalf. Simply a message carrier. I know my work is finished now almost. Once I have handed them over to you.

I don't have a criminal record or anything and I'm not a terrorist!

The feathered Serpent did say in Peru at the dawn of time (as we know it) he would return. He was very pointed about it according to legend. He came to Her in Human form. This time they present in their natural shape.

I can understand the awe the ancients must have felt at the original UFO landing. I feel incredible peace near Her. But I am normally non-aggressive anyway so I'm not too surprised.

I was thinking of walking into RAF Sealand at Chester. But I thought the C-in-C of the base would react negatively and hold-up things. Assuming I got past the gate guard that is.

Please move quickly. It's vital you do. If you want to meet Her too.

Your first reaction to this letter will be one of pure disbelief however, let me assure you I am neither insane or a charlatan as the facts will prove.

During W.W.2., as I am sure you are aware, a crashed U.F.O. was recovered by the military somewhere in this country. I should like to know the exact date and location of this event?

It is possible this was Pusslock Warren the location of which I am as yet unable to discover. Although Spectra rule me they will not tell me why I am here.

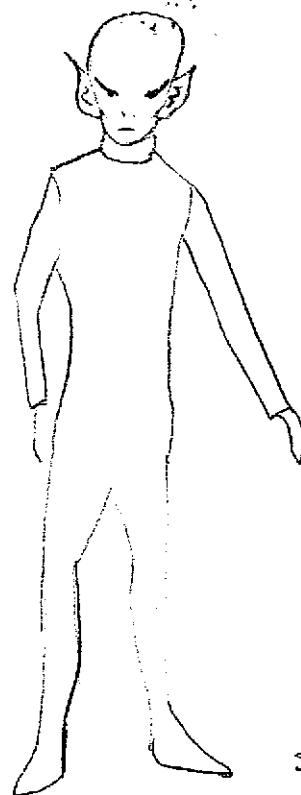
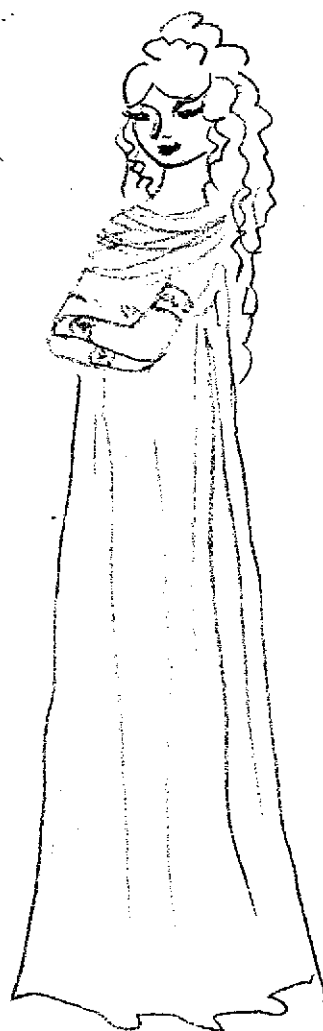
They have an other body just like this one. It lies in a bed wearing a sort of helmet from which hangs a thick cable plugged into a computer probable, behind a panel on the wall.

I am writing in response to the letter received, dated 9 March 1982. As my information can no longer be considered as classified, I am now able to pass it onto you.

The letter that I sent to you, was only a small fraction, of the work that I had done on U.F.O. research. I was in fact in physical and psychic contact with an E.T. called Algar; whom I have had a relationship with since 1958, and it continued until 1981, when he was killed by another race of beings.

So to start at the beginning. I was seven years old, when I first saw traces left by a U.F.O. At the time I lived at [REDACTED], Glasgow. One Saturday, morning I had the impression that I should go out to the back, so much it was like an obsession (DIA 1). When I did go to the back, I found three indentations in the ground, they were in triangular formation. Each indentation was the same distance from it's partner, and they gave the impression that three large ball bearings had been dropped there. My first thought was that it was a U.F.O.; but I had never ever heard of U.F.O. or flying saucers, and yet the thought seemed normal to me, as if I used it on a regular basis. I told my father, who was rather quick at ridiculing and poo-pooing what I had told him. Anyway, a couple of months later, the first visit came from E.T.s, which was followed by a few more. They were of green gas which solidified when it came in from the passage way, which led to the toilet under, the door, and the wardrobe, which was situated against the door preventing it from opening. (DIA 2). There was one which was green and very large. that had eyes all over it, this one came three times. Then there was a woman with very sharp features, and what looked like fat worms sticking out of her head, where the hair should be. The last visit from the large green thing happened when my father tried to get into the bedroom, as usual I was against the door, with fear. My father was at the time, fairly athelletic and no weakling, but no matter how hard he pushed he could not get the door open; not until the large green thing had gone.

In 1959, I found semi-transparent, slug like creatures crawling up the wall on the opposite side of the back. At this period of time I was in with a band, especially, the lead singer [REDACTED] and the drummer [REDACTED]. Both of them saw the creatures. The end product of this was that we armed ourselves and started to shoot them, we used .22 air rifles at a range of fifty to seventy five yards. When we did kill them, they fell off the wall and took on the appearance of cement that had got damp and solidified. Quite often they would fall and appear to go through the ground leaving no trace at all. One day we found that we were unable to hit our targets, and we could see our shots pass through the targets, by the ricochete off the wall, and after that we found that it was a waste of time trying to shoot them, so we gave up as a bad job. (DIA 3).

I was stationed at [REDACTED] Barracks - [REDACTED] and Algar was with me then, even in spite of other E.T.s going away. A strong bond was forming of friendship and trust. One incident involves telepathic contact, and that occurred, following an incident when I was unusually indecisive. It was when I was on guard duty, and I was asked if I would like the first tour, to which I normally said yes, but thank God I eventually declined, for the first one was critically injured with the nick elf he was carrying. It was on the basis of safety, that we were to go in pairs from then on, and it was under these conditions that I got a telepathic link with Algar. We were returning to the guard house after our patrol, and to our right was a field, which had lighting only on the road on which we were walking. Apart from the lighting mentioned, the field was totally dark. I heard only what I can describe as a whisper, and it was saying that someone was creeping about in the field, to the front and slightly right. I immediately looked in that direction but saw nothing. But as I had heard this whisper several times before, and it had proved accurate, I decided to follow it through. I sent my partner around the camp museum, which was situated about twenty yards behind us, and I went to a lamp, and prepared to go into the field. It was at this point, when someone came out of the dark. I then called my partner and after a few heated words, I convinced the stranger who had no i.d. on him, to accompany us to the guard house. (DIA 4).

The real work began in May, 1979, when my wife and I formed a team, and together we collected such data as:- what the different coloured lights on a U.F.O. means, how they manage to evade radar, what fuel they use and what it looks like, I have been to their bases which were in Wirral and Cheshire. There was a curious incident which took place over the river Mersey, by the Wallasey Town Hall. There were six U.F.O.s flying at speed up and down the river, when I noticed a black one was trying to manoeuvre the other six. Unfortunately, the black one was shot down, it hit the water in front of the Town Hall. As I was watching, the front end of the U.F.O. hit the water, then the whole U.F.O. disappeared; leaving the water to splash, as if done by an invisible entity.

In June, 1981, Algar, was ready to approach the government in person. I was over the moon with pride to be used as the medium between alien race and our own race. Unfortunately, another race of E.T. decided to attack Algar, and his team of scientists, and killed Algar and several members of his team. That of course was that. It was not until October, 24 1981, that they sent some one to dominate me by using threats, and eventually attacking me, the E.T. died during his attack on me. Since there have been four responses to my telepathic messages sent out, but two of those contacts have been lost. But of the two who are still in contact, one is a woman, but I am unable to give you her name. The other is a male and his name is Maloben, he says he comes from the Milky Way, and that his planet is called Platone.

I am intending to make contacts strong, and hopefully make a meeting between the alien race and our Government, with the information that I have now given you, I hope that you would reconsider sponsoring my research. The information that I have given you is accurate and truthful. Although there is lots more. I decided to give you what I thought was the most important to you.

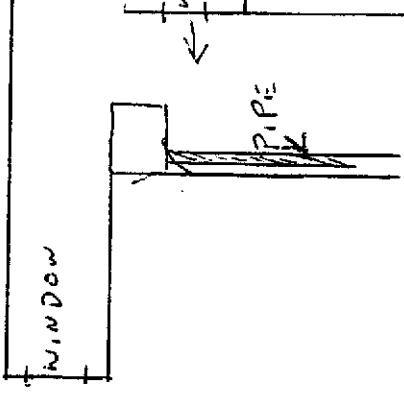
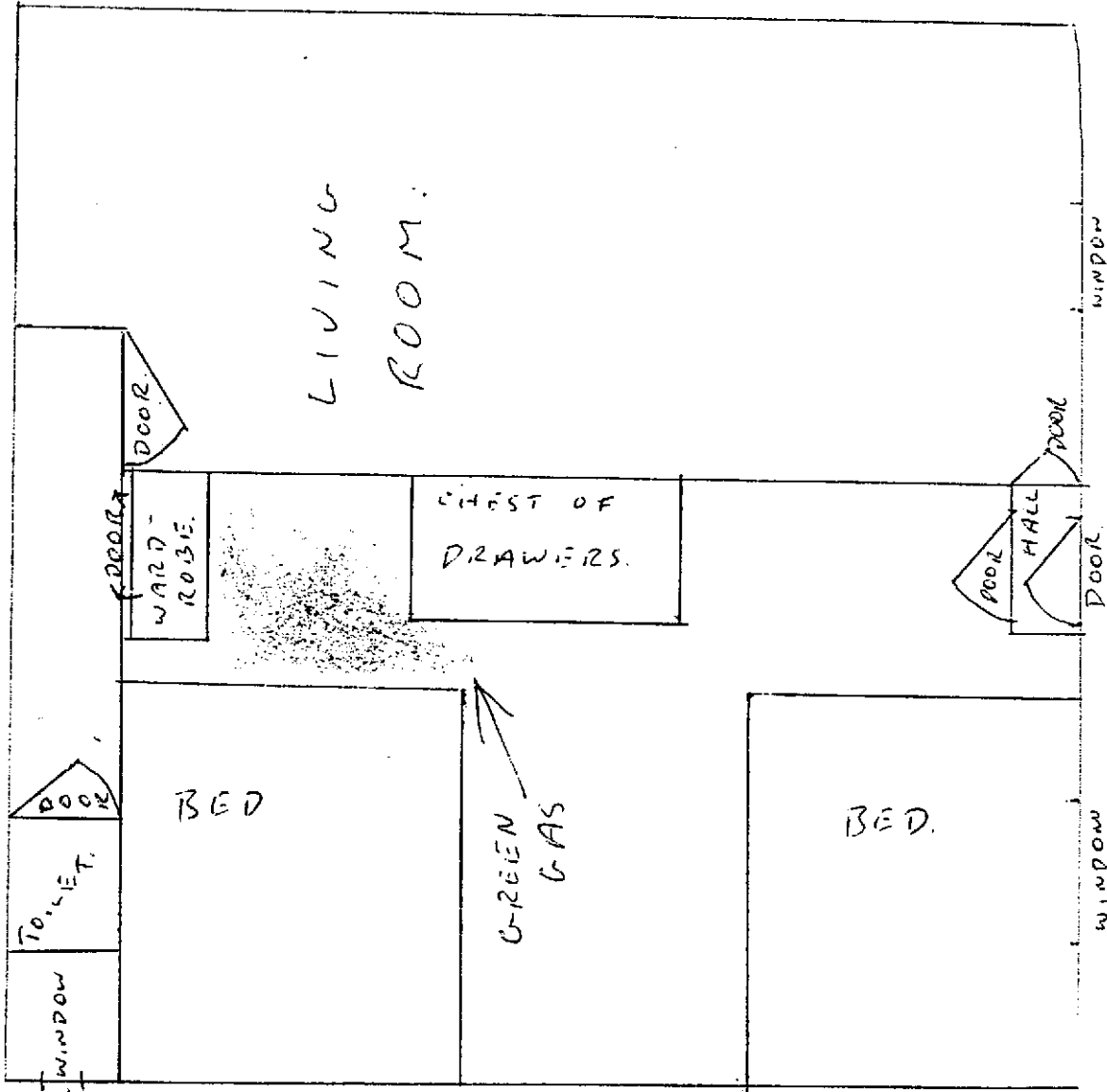

Further to my letter of 13 October I am now in a position to give you a substantive reply to your request for copies of internal MOD files and correspondence relating to Mr Pope's book *Open Skies, Closed Minds*.

In light of your letters of 2nd and 11th September and your further request to include papers held by the Publications Clearance Branch, we have reviewed the papers concerned to see if any of the documents could be released with some redaction. We have, however, reached the conclusion that it is not possible to supply the information you have requested, but it may assist you if we clarify our reasons for this decision.

Ministry of Defence regulations state that any serving or former member of the Armed Forces or Civil Service who wish to publish a book, monograph, article, letter of other textual material concerning information or experience they gained as a result of their official duties, must seek permission from the appropriate Departmental Publications Clearance Branch before publication. A copy of the manuscript is supplied, and the Publications Clearance Branch, in consultation with the Branches concerned with the subject matter, examine it for any details which may cause concern with regard to comments or disclosure of material such as: classified information; information given to the MOD in confidence; comments about relations between Civil Servants and Ministers; information that would undermine security or our national interests or anything that MOD would regard as objectionable about individuals or organisations. Any concerns raised are discussed with the author before permission for publication is granted. I must stress that this process is not designed to stop individuals expressing their personal views, even if these differ from those of the MOD, but rather to prevent the release of information which would be inappropriate for the reasons stated and to ensure that any personal viewpoint is not presented as MOD policy.

With regard to the documents that you have requested, these contain personal data relating to Mr Pope and others, the further processing of which must meet Data Protection Act 1998 requirements, and internal discussion about the contents of Mr Pope's original manuscript (some of which may not have appeared in the final published version of his book). In engaging in the

publication clearance process Mr Pope would have reason to expect that his manuscript and correspondence about its contents would remain confidential between himself and his employer and would not be disclosed to a third party without his permission. It would also undermine the whole process if individuals are requested to remove or alter text before publication and that which is changed, is later communicated to a third party.

Your request is therefore refused since to lawfully process the personal data within the material requires compliance with the Data Protection Act 98 and in our opinion none of the processing conditions permit MOD lawfully disclosing to you. Your request is also refused under Exemption 2 (Internal discussion and advice) and Exemption 14 (Information given in confidence) of the Code of Practice on Access to Government Information.

You have proposed redaction of the personal data and release of the remaining text. On careful consideration of the material and in view of the definition of personal data within the Act we have concluded that personal data is so interwoven within the material that extraction would not be straightforward and would not leave a meaningful text. In any case, such an attempt would be nugatory given any remaining text would be subject to the Code Exemptions cited.

If you are unhappy with our decision to refuse you information under the Data Protection Act 1998 you may ask MOD to review this decision by writing to MOD's Data Protection Officer, [REDACTED] in Room 604, St Giles Court, 1-13 St Giles High Street, London WC2H 8LD setting out your reasons. This does not affect your right to approach the Information Commissioner, which you may do at any time.

If you wish to appeal against our decision to refuse information under the Code of Practice on Access to Government Information, you should write to the Ministry of Defence, Directorate of Information (Exploitation), Room 819B, St Giles Court, 1-13 St Giles High Street, London WC2H 8LD requesting that the decision be reviewed. If following the internal review you remain dissatisfied, you may ask a Member of Parliament to take up the case with the Parliamentary Commissioner for Administration (the Ombudsman) who can investigate on your behalf. The Ombudsman will not, however, consider an investigation until the internal review process has been completed.

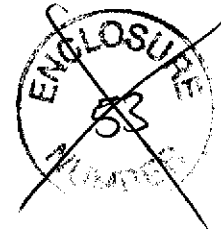

1. Thank you for reference which I have discussed with CL(FS)-Legal 1 and this is our combined response. Having examined the material involved we agree that it should be withheld from [REDACTED] for the reasons identified. I think that the line given to the Press Office in June 95 in response to the Mail on Sunday remains valid today, namely that details of specific applications for approval are private between the Department and the individual concerned.

2. It is important to recognise that it is not just Mr Pope's rights under DPA 98 that are at issue. Personal data relating to many other parties is included in the material and the same considerations apply equally to them. Also I am a little hesitant about describing information from Mr Pope as being supplied "in confidence". I think it more accurate to say that Mr Pope might reasonably expect that the correspondence formed part of the employer/employee relationship giving rise to the common law duty of confidentiality.

3. We have looked carefully at the material and that marked personal information. There are passages not marked which we consider to also be personal data. In fact there is so much that could be described as personal data within the papers that its redaction is unlikely to leave a meaningful text. I attach one document with additional personal data highlighted as an illustration of this. As a result there are some suggested amendments to the draft reply to [REDACTED] on 40 [REDACTED] as attached. I have added a new paragraph to address [REDACTED] suggestion of redacting personal data. On reflection, it would be sensible for any appeal from [REDACTED] on the DPA aspects to be sent here rather than the PTC DPO in this case which is rather more complex than the relatively straightforward SAR complaints that the internal complaints procedure was set up to handle.

Your request is therefore refused since to lawfully process the personal data within the material requires compliance with the DPA 98 and in our opinion none of the processing conditions permit MOD's lawfully disclosing to you. Your request is also refused under Exemption 2 (Internal discussion and advice) and Exemption 14 (Information given in confidence) of the Code of Practice on Access to Government Information.

You have proposed redaction of the personal data and release of the remaining text. On careful consideration of the material and in view of the definition of personal data within the Act we have concluded that personal data is so interwoven within the material that extraction would not be straightforward and would not leave a meaningful text. In any case, such an attempt would be nugatory given any remaining text would be subject to the Code Exemptions cited.

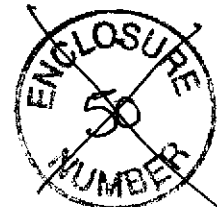

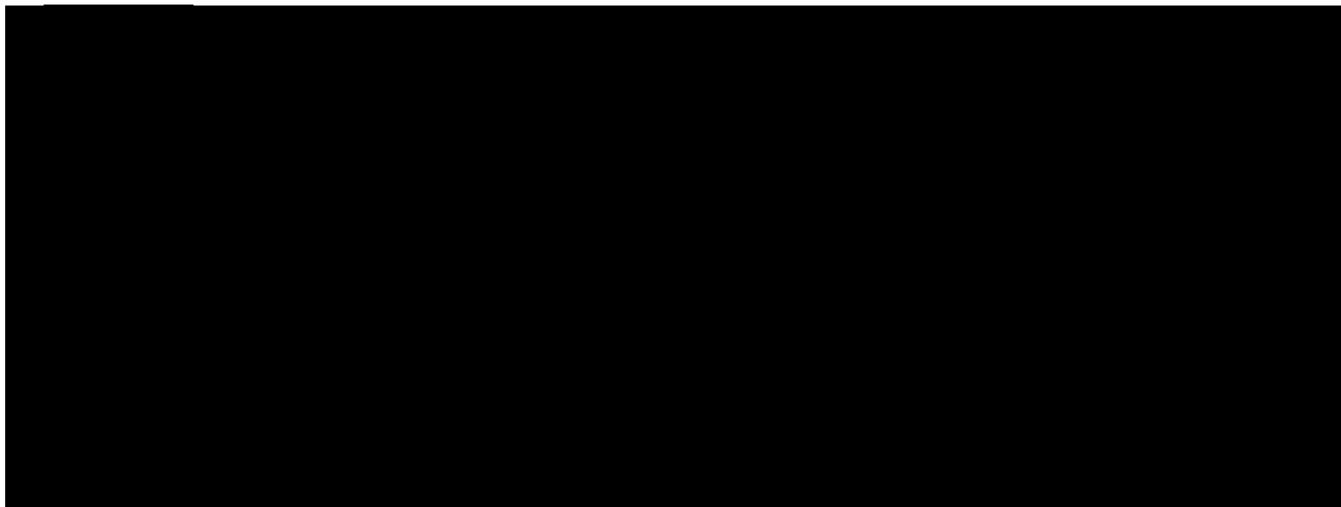
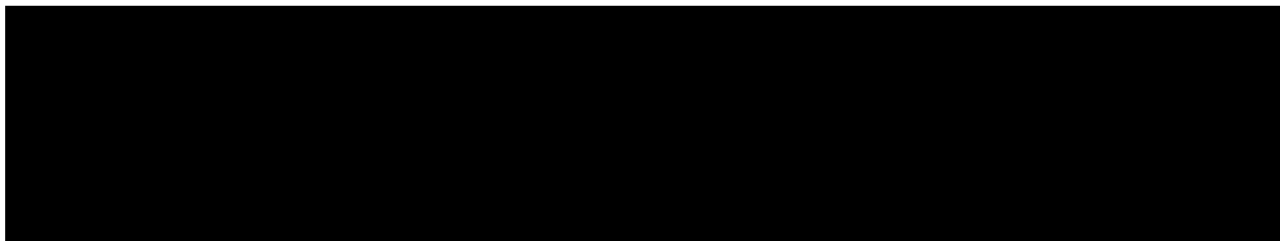

When considering this request we have to balance ██████████ right to request access to information under the Code of Practice on Access to Government Information (the Code) and the wider public interest in the information, with the rights of Mr Pope under the Data Protection Act 1998. Mr Pope may also reasonably expect that we would not disclose to a third party information which he may have understood was supplied in confidence.



5. I therefore propose that we withhold all of these papers, partly under the Data Protection Act 1998, and partly under Exemption 2 (*Internal discussion and advice- internal opinion, advice, recommendation, consultation and deliberation*), and Exemption 14 (*Information given in confidence-information supplied by a person who was not under any legal obligation, whether actual or implied to supply it, and has not consented to its disclosure*) of the Code.

Section 6 Disclosure of Information

6.1 Principles governing disclosure of information

This section describes the principles governing the public disclosure of information by serving or former members of the Department and sets out the rules that apply those principles to specific cases. The activities governed by this section are:

- public lectures and speeches, interviews with or communications to the press or other media, film, radio and television appearances and statements to non-Governmental bodies, including MOD-sponsored conferences and seminars;
- books, monographs, articles, letters or other text, including supposed fiction;
- theses for degrees, diplomas or MOD-sponsored fellowships;
- participation in outside study conferences, seminars and discussions.

You must not make comment on, or make disclosure of:

- classified or "in confidence" information;
- relations between civil servants and Ministers, and advice given to Ministers;
- politically controversial issues;
- material covered by copyright, unless prior permission has been obtained. Particular care must be taken where the origin of the material is obscure;
- information that would conflict with MOD interests or bring the Civil Service into disrepute;
- information that may jeopardise the commercial interests of the MOD or companies or organisations collaborating with the MOD;
- information that would undermine the security or other national interests of collaborating countries;
- anything that the MOD would regard as objectionable about individuals or organisations;

You must not publish or broadcast personal memoirs reflecting your experience as a Government official, or enter into commitments to do so, while in Crown employment.

6.2 Greater openness in Government requires:

- the fullest possible exposition to Parliament and the public of the reasons for Government policies and decisions once these have been announced; and

- improving public understanding about the way the processes of Government work and the factual and technical background to Government policies and decisions.

Ministers are responsible for the exposition of Government policies and decisions. Staff must avoid being drawn into public discussion on justification of Government policies.

6.3 Seeking permission

You must obtain authority, before taking part in any outside activity involving:

- the disclosure of information obtained in the course of official duties;
- the use of official experience;
- the public expression of views on official matters.

*Chapter 3
Annex M*

The procedures for obtaining permission are set out in Annex M to Chapter 3.

You are responsible for seeking this authority in sufficient time to allow proper consideration. Failure to obtain permission before undertaking any such activity is a disciplinary offence.

Elected officials of a recognised trades union or staff association do not need to obtain MOD authority if they are publicising their association's or union's views on an official matter which, because it directly affects the conditions of service of members, is of legitimate interest to them. This exemption does not apply to the (probably rare) case where the official duties of the union or association representative as a public servant are directly concerned with the matter in question;

Paragraph 6.1

You do not need permission to take part in activities organised by, or on behalf of, unions or staff associations, although conduct in public should still be consistent with the principles set out above.

6.4 International organisations

When serving in an international organisation, or with visiting forces, you must observe the rules and regulations of that body. You must consult Defence Information Division (D-INFOD) wherever material concerns the UK, or in any cases of doubt.

6.5 Former members of staff

After leaving the Department you must obtain official sanction from the MOD before publishing any information gained as a result of your official duties.

6.6 Press announcements

Official communications to the Press are made by the public relations staff, or other duly authorised personnel. You must not comment on issues of a politically controversial nature.

6.7 Broadcasts and media interviews

If you are approached directly about participation in a radio or TV programme, or about co-operating in the production of a programme you must report the matter in accordance with the detailed instructions in Annex M to Chapter 3. A member of the Defence Information Division or a duly authorised officer must be present at all press interviews.

6.8 Release of information at MOD conferences, seminars, etc
Sponsors of MOD conferences and seminars, at which classified information is to be discussed, must obtain approval from AD CB Sy before issuing invitations.

6.9 Political conferences
You must obtain the permission from a senior line manager before attending conferences of a political nature in an official capacity.

6.10 Outside seminars and study conferences
If you receive an invitation from a non-governmental body to participate in a study, conference, seminar or discussion you must seek prior permission from:

- D News CPO – (Chief Press Officer) if serving in Ministry of Defence Headquarters;
- D Def Sy (Scientific and Technical), if DPA or DSTL personnel (for clearance of material);
- the TLB holder or his or her delegated representative, if working outside MOD HQ.

In any case of doubt you must consult D Def Pol. You must submit texts in advance in accordance with the procedures set out in the Annex M to Chapter 3.

6.11 Outside organisations
You do not need prior approval to take part in the proceedings of the following institutes:

- International Institute for Strategic Studies (IISS).
- Royal Institute of International Affairs (RIIA).
- Royal United Services Institute for Defence Studies (RUSI).

Your participation is, however, subject to the following conditions:

- if nominated by the MOD to participate in a study, conference or seminar on defence problems you are encouraged to make as useful a contribution as possible but, if you are in doubt, you should consult D Def Pol;
- when participating in a discussion, you must be aware that your remarks may be reported and publicised: you should avoid conflict with MOD or Government policy;

- you must not reveal classified or commercially sensitive material.

6.12 Questionnaires
You must not:

- complete outside questionnaires if it involves disclosing detailed and significant information about official duties. If in doubt you must consult the security officer or the appropriate publication clearance authority;

- take part in your official capacity in surveys or research projects, even unattributably, if they deal with attitudes or opinions on political matters or matters of policy.

6.13 Disclosure to others

Instructions are contained in the relevant security manuals about disclosure of information to:

- MPs;
- foreign governments or foreigners;
- committee members, consultants and defence lecturers;
- contractors.

6.14 Defence Press and Broadcasting Advisory Committee (DPBAC)

Defence Advisory Notices are addressed to national and provincial newspaper editors, to radio and television organisations, and to some publishers or periodicals and books on defence and related subjects. (DA Notices are issued and amended on the authority of the DPBAC). The Secretary of the DPBAC is available at all times to advise on questions that arise on the application of a DA Notice to some particular set of circumstances. Any advice requested by the press as a whole on the publication of items of information which appear to come within the scope of a DA Notice should be referred to the Secretary DPBAC.

Annex N **Confidentiality and Official Information**

1 Rules

Departments and agencies must remind staff on appointment, retirement or resignation that they are bound by the provisions of the criminal law, including the Official Secrets Act, which protect certain categories of official information, and by their duty of confidentiality owed to the Crown as their former employee.

2 Standards of conduct to be reflected in local staff regulations

Civil servants are expected to be prepared to make available official information which is not held in confidence within Government, in accordance with Government policy and departmental or agency instructions. They must not, without relevant authorisation, disclose official information which has been communicated in confidence within Government or received in confidence from others.

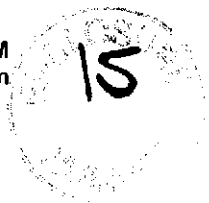
3 Civil servants must continue to observe this duty of confidentiality after they have left Crown employment.

4 Civil servants must not take part in any activities or make any public statement which might involve the disclosure of official information or draw upon experience gained in their official capacity without the prior approval of their department or agency. They must clear in advance material for publication, broadcasts or public discussion which draws on official information or experience.

5 Civil servants must not publish or broadcast personal memoirs reflecting their experience in Government, or enter into commitments to do so, whilst in Crown employment. The permission of the Head of the Department and the Head of the Home Civil Service must be sought before entering into commitments to publish such memoirs after leaving the service.

6 Civil servants must not seek to frustrate the policies or decisions of Ministers by the use or disclosure outside the Government of any information to which they have had access as civil servants.

7 Civil servants must not take part in their official capacities in surveys or research projects, even attributably, if they deal with attitudes or opinions on political matters or matters of policy.

Annex M Procedures for Seeking Permission to Speak in Public, to Lecture, or to Write for Publication

1 Public speaking

Note ¹

Applications or proposals to make public speeches, or film, radio or television appearances, or to communicate with the Press or other non-Governmental bodies, are to be made as follows:

Note ² & ³

- Staff serving in Ministry of Defence Headquarters must seek prior approval from the Press Secretary and Chief of Information (D-INFOD), through their Director or Head of Division. Exceptions to this rule are authorized for Meteorological Office staff and for certain other individuals whose duties bring them into regular contact with the Press and public, but D-INFOD should be consulted in any case of doubt.

Note ³

- Staff serving outside MOD Headquarters must seek the prior approval of their TLB holder, or of the officer to whom his responsibility for giving approval has been delegated. In unusual circumstances, or in any case of doubt, the TLB holder, or his authorized representative, is to consult the Press Secretary and Chief of Information. If there is insufficient time for the necessary consultation, the invitation should normally be refused.

2 It may be desirable and useful to seek permission in principle before embarking on the preparation of the full text where the activity is to be given advance publicity.

3 The rules on payments for broadcasting, lecturing or writing for publication are in Chapter 2, Section 4.

4 Lecturing or writing for publication

Applications for permission to publish any book, monograph, article, letter or other textual material, to give a public lecture or to put forward any thesis for a degree or diploma must be submitted through the author's senior line manager to

- DCC(Navy) by RN TLBs
- DCC(Army) by Army TLBs and the GOC NI TLB
- AHB(RAF) PCB (Air) by RAF TLBs
- D Def Sy (Scientific & Technical) CDP's TLB and for all scientific and technical subjects from any other TLB, using MOD Form 655
- D News Policy by other TLBs.

1 Public speeches should be submitted for prior clearance under the procedures for lectures (paragraph 4) if their text is likely to be published afterwards, or quoted by a broadcasting authority, newspaper or magazine, either in whole or in part if they contain scientific or technical data, or if they comment on DPA projects, so that they may be fully cleared in all respects, including Crown copyright aspects.

2 Because service in the Ministry of Defence is likely to be regarded as conferring a special degree of authority or importance on statements made by an official speaker, Ministerial approval will be sought by D-INFOD in all cases concerning personnel serving in the Ministry of Defence.

3 Normally permission to express views on politically controversial issues will be refused. For any exception to this rule, D-INFOD will seek the prior approval of the Secretary of State for Defence.

- 5 Staff who undertake a MOD-sponsored Defence Fellowship, a NATO Research Fellowship or a M Phil Degree Course in International Relations at Cambridge, and wish to publish the resulting thesis should submit their application through D Def Pol.
- 6 Staff must not enter into commitments or negotiations with private publishers or the organizers of lectures or discussion groups before authority is obtained. Authors who wish to make forward plans or to give advance publicity to any such activity are advised to submit a brief synopsis of the text for approval in principle; the full text must not be forwarded to publishers or other outside bodies before full approval has been given, and it must make it clear to any organisers that participation is subject to clearance of the full text.
- 7 Texts should be complete with illustrations, drawings, etc. They should be typewritten and submitted in duplicate. Material for clearance should reach the appropriate clearance authority as soon as possible and not later than three clear weeks before it is required, as controversial and technical material or lengthy books may take a considerable time to clear. Cases of special urgency can be considered on their merits. If, however, the work is based on or includes any element of official material, information or experience, additional problems of Crown copyright may be involved, and the advice of Copyright Control Section, MOD Library, Great Scotland Yard is to be sought before any commitment is made to use such material. Written permission must be obtained from them to reproduce all Crown copyright material, including extracts, photographs, badges etc in a publication or on a manufactured item, which is not itself Crown copyright. Permission may be subject to payment of a reproduction fee. If D-INFOD staff recommend that there is direct PR value to the MOD, then Copyright Control Section, MOD Library, Great Scotland Yard may appropriately either reduce or waive the reproduction fee. MOD authors should submit such cases to DPR staff for recommendation.
- 8 Applicants must make it clear in their submission to their senior line managers whether or not:
 - use has been made of official material (published or unpublished) either by inclusion of extracts from official documents or by the use of official documents as a basis for the work;
 - the work includes non-official material (eg material obtained from a commercial or private source) and, if so, whether the copyright holder has given written permission for its use;
 - the work is based wholly or partly on their official experience or duties; if the latter, the proportion based on official experience should be stated;
 - the work was done in official time, their own time, or both; if the last, the proportions should be stated;
 - official typing or reproduction facilities were used in preparing the manuscript;
 - a fee or other payment is expected; if so, the amount should be stated.

- 9 The senior line manager must state whether or not publication is recommended when forwarding the application to the clearance authority. His or her comments should accompany that statement whenever it is deemed necessary to comment on any aspects of the application, and particularly where the material deals with scientific, technical or medical matters that are the concern of his or her Establishment.
- 10 Permission to publish will apply only to the text as submitted; if any alternations, other than those of a purely editorial nature, are made after permission has been given, further authority must be sought for the alterations. The granting of permission to publish does not confer official endorsement of the content of the text. Statements tending to imply that official approval has been given, or references to the fact that permission has been granted, must not be included in any part of the text and are not to be made separately. A copy of the text will be retained by the Department for reference.

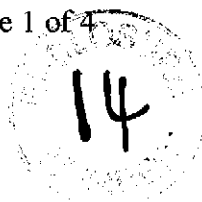

NO. 2: HANDLING SUBJECT ACCESS REQUESTS (SARs)

Under DPA98, individuals (data subjects) are entitled to receive copies of their personal data. Data subjects must submit a written request (a Subject Access Request) for such data, either in letter form or on a MOD Form 1694. The SAR must be accompanied by proof of identity e.g. a recent utilities bill, a copy of an extract from a passport, driving licence etc. A SAR does not have to mention DPA98 specifically.

The MOD has 40 calendar days from receipt of a SAR containing enough information for the individual to be identified and the nature of his request understood in which to provide the complete composite MOD reply to the individual. Any longer period will be a breach of the Act. Speed of handling is therefore essential.

SARs from current Service and civilian personnel

In the first instance, individuals should send their request on the attached SAR form to their own unit DPO. Information is not to be supplied to telephone enquirers. If the unit is unable to provide the information sought, or the reply requires co-ordination, the unit is to send the form to either:

- The next tier up in the TLB/Agency (if that is where all the remaining data are located) or
- If the reply is likely to require co-ordination across one or more TLBs/Agencies, then the SAR is to be sent to the appropriate single Service SAR Co-ordinator (if the requester is a Service person) or that TLB/Agency's CPMA (for civilian personnel). They will collate the information and reply to the requester. The single Service SAR Co-ordinators are: NMASec3, APC Secretary, and PMA(RAF) Secretary.

SARs from former Service and civilian personnel

These are likely to come into the system at various points. It is likely to be clear from the SAR that the requester is a former member of the Department. If whoever receives the request can answer it fully, they are to do so. If they cannot, they are to pass the request straight to:

Service - the appropriate single Service SAR Co-ordinator.

Civilian - the TLB DPO, who, if the individual has left MOD within the last 12 months, will try to identify the appropriate PMA. If the individual has not been employed by MOD in the last 12 months and the PMA cannot be identified, the SAR is to be referred to DSDC Llangennech, who will refer it, together with the personnel records, to the PMA who last managed the individual.

The 40-day clock does not start ticking until individuals have provided both confirmation of their identity and enough information to enable MOD to start searching for their records.

SARs from Parliamentarians

The term "Parliamentarian" covers MPs and Peers at Westminster, members of the three devolved legislatures (Members of the Scottish Parliament (MSP), Welsh Assembly Members (WAM) and Members of the London Assembly (MLA)). SARs from Parliamentarians should be passed immediately to the Parliamentary Clerk, who will arrange for the necessary trawl around MOD using the DPO/DPA network and for the reply to be sent to the Parliamentarian.

Any personal data relating to the Parliamentarian provided to the Parliamentary Clerk as a result of the search should be redacted, copied and compiled in a stand-alone format so that it can be attached to the reply without further action from the Parliamentary Clerk. Where the personal data consists of a short passage in a longer document, e.g. in a PQ background note, it will usually be preferable to reproduce the text on a clean sheet of paper (example follows:)

The following extracts come from the Background Note that must accompany draft answers to Parliamentary Questions when they are submitted to Ministers for approval:

- *"This is the first question raised by A. N. Other (Conservative, Neverland) about this incident ... Mr Other has also recently written on behalf of a constituent about the authorisation of such an event."*
- *"This MP has not previously asked a question on the 1234 Project – or any other procurement issue. We are not aware of a constituency interest in the 1234 programme."*

Correspondence from Parliamentarians involving disclosure of personal data relating to their constituents or others must be handled in accordance with Guidance Note 16.

SARs from Ministry of Defence Police (MDP) Officers

SARs from MDP Officers should be sent to:

MDP(Sec) will liaise within the Department as necessary and respond to the Officer.

All Other SARs

This includes requests from former Service and civilian personnel who have not identified themselves as such in their initial letter to MOD, as well as foreign nationals or those who have no employment link with the Department (e.g. journalists, authors or

members of the public). In such cases, whoever receives the letter should send it, without acknowledgement, to the appropriate SAR Co-ordinator (if the Service or civilian recipient is on a Service unit) or the appropriate TLB/Agency DPO (if the recipient is a member of an entirely civilian unit). The SAR Co-ordinator/DPO is to send the requester a copy of the attached specimen letter, appropriately modified. If, on receipt of the reply (which needs to contain enough information to start searching for that individual's records and confirmation of their identity), they can answer the request fully, they are to do so. If they cannot, they are to consider who is best placed to reply and redirect the request accordingly. Common sense will need to be applied.

Charging

Current MOD policy is not to charge anyone making a request to see their records, whether they are non-medical or medical. Any payment should therefore be returned with the reply.

Complaints procedure

DPA 98 allows individuals to complain to the Information Commissioner if they consider that an organisation has not handled their personal data in accordance with the Act. Before that step is taken, we would prefer the individual to use the following appeal procedure:

- The first reply to the requester should ask them to contact the writer if they are unhappy with the reply.
- Should the requester do so, the next reply must conclude with the following wording:

"If you feel that the information in this reply is incomplete or it does not reflect the information you believe might be held about you, you may ask MOD to review the reply (or the decision not to release the information) or ask for further information. In such circumstances you should set out your reasons and write to:

(Name and contact - see below)

This does not affect your right to approach the Information Commissioner, which you may do at any time."

The contact details are:

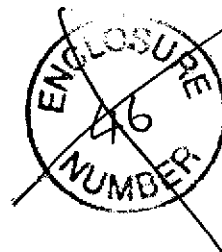
- Unit-level letters should provide the details of their appropriate TLB/Agency/CPMA Data Protection Officer.
- TLB/Agency/CPMA letters should provide the details of the appropriate single Service/Civilian DPO.
- Single Service/Civilian DPO should provide the details of the MOD DPO. (Mrs Alexander is to be referred to as "the MOD DPO" and not as "DC&L(F&S)". Her post title could well give the wrong impression to those unfamiliar with the Department.)

This procedure applies, irrespective of whether the requester is a current or former member of the MOD or has no employment links with the Department. It does not remove the right of serving personnel to use either redress of complaint (for Service personnel) or the grievance procedures (for civilian staff) if they consider that incorrect data or information processed had led to an injustice. We hope that the system above will deliver a speedier response than using either of the existing Departmental complaints procedures. Internal delay in addressing DPA-related complaints could well lead to individuals appealing to the Information Commissioner on matters that could easily be resolved within the Department.

ET lives, says man from the Ministry

IT WAS the week when John Redwood's earthly origins were called into doubt and Mr Spock's pointy ears were given away by the thousand.

So it will come as no surprise that one of Whitehall's finest has succumbed to the power of alienia.

Nick Pope headed the Secretariat (Air Staff) office, with a brief to deal with inquiries about flying saucers and other unexplained phenomena.

It was his calm voice which reassured the many members of the public who called to report strange lights in the sky or a little green man on the lawn. But in possibly the most embarrassing turnaround in Ministry of Defence history, Mr Pope has gone over to the other side of the fence. For the horror of his

many friends at the Ministry. In fact, his bosses have already expressed their displeasure at his manuscript, for which he must get permission before publication.

The book examines all the available records in the Whitehall archives, and talks about a number of new cases.

But Mr Pope offers little comfort for UFO buffs seeking proof of a Government cover-up.

'We don't throw open our files en bloc, but eventually most of them filter down to the Public Record Office.'

Mr Pope cannot pinpoint the moment of his conversion, but he rules out an alien plot.

He says he was convinced by the details of a small number of British sightings, which have so far defied conventional explanation.

'Probably the best example is the Rendlesham Forest case in December 1980, where

editor of UFO Magazine said: 'I welcome the bravery of a man who must have experienced tremendous pressure from his superiors, but who stuck to his views.'

The MOD refused to comment on Mr Pope.

But surely the men from the Ministry are wishing that someone, somewhere, would beam him up.

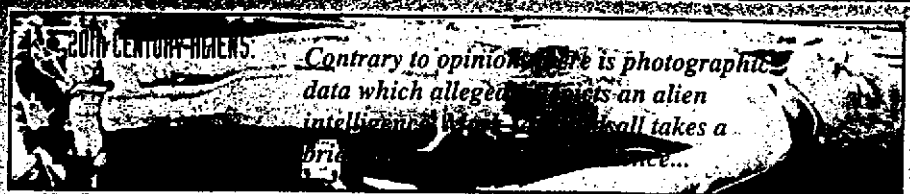
In effect, those who have a vested interest in the commercial marketing and promotion of this footage have excluded those within the international UFO community who would dare to challenge the authenticity of this film.

Nick is now firmly of the opinion that UFOs and the ETH (extraterrestrial hypothesis) are one of the same. He is still employed by the MoD, who are naturally feeling somewhat uneasy at his decision to speak out so publicly. I can tell you that his decision to "come out" was not taken lightly, but he is willing to accept the consequences. It took an extraordinary amount of courage to do what he has done. His life is about to change forever, and we should all offer him our total support.

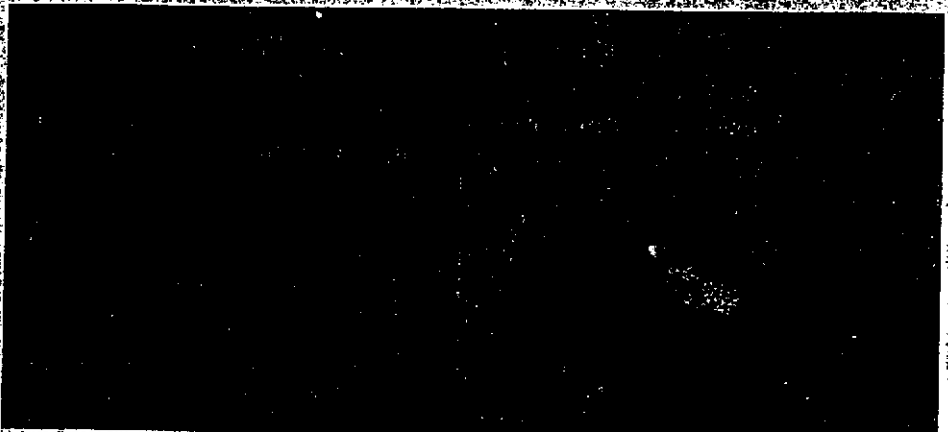
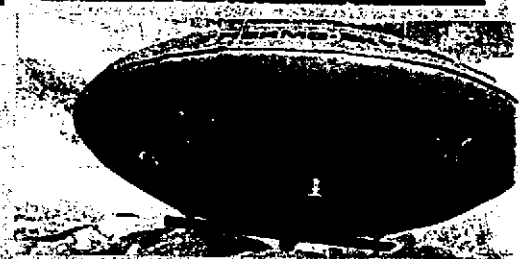

Scanners of the alien nation

DONT call me a fruitcake, but listen: on a warm summer's day at the age of eight, I lay on my back on the grassy playing fields, looked up and saw an unidentified flying object. A tiny triangular glint in the sky. My chums saw it, too. The local paper got wind and there was a little column, dripping sarcasm. The little green men were coming to take us kids away, jeer on, but I had seen something. What it was, who knows?

This event hovered back into my mind last week in a Whitehall wine bar while talking to the British Government's foremost expert on UFOs. Nick Pope is a civil servant who has spent four years analysing reports of sightings of Unidentified Flying Objects for the Ministry of Defence. He is a sane, cautious, bespectacled 29-year-old, 10 years at the MoD. He speaks in the carefully draughted idiom of the Whitehall memo, emphasising that his beliefs are personal, not those of the Secretary of State for Defence, Michael Portillo — himself rumoured not to be as other earthen.

From 1991 to 1994 I worked in the Secretariat (Air Staff) 2A. I was the MoD's UFO desk officer. I came into that job with an open mind. After having seen all the evidence and the expert testimony, I came out of that job believing that a very small percentage of what are commonly termed UFOs may well be extra-terrestrial in origin.

Had he ever seen a UFO, I asked him? 'No.'

I came clean about my expertise. He looked at me, the unbelieved, with something approaching envy in his eyes.

THE OBSERVER ESSAY

The UFO Research Association hosts its eighth Congress on Saturday. It is sold out, and reports from the final frontier say business is better than ever.

Still at the MOD, but no longer on the UFO desk, Pope has suffered for his views. His nickname in the MOD is 'Spooky', that of Fox Mulder, a character in the cult TV series *X-Files*. When he walks along the corridor, fellow civil servants whistle the theme from Steven Spielberg's film, *Close Encounters of the Third Kind*. His chances of becoming a permanent under-secretary have dimmed. And yet: 'We received between 2,000 and 3,000 UFO reports each year. We knew this was the tip of the iceberg because most people didn't know how to report a UFO, that is who to contact, or they were afraid of the ridicule.'

Among those 2,000 to 3,000 reports we always figured that 95 per cent could be explained away in terms of known objects or phenomena. I know all the explanations: flocks of geese, aircraft lights, satellites, meteors, fireballs, ball lightning, lasers and searchlights reflecting off low cloud, hoaxes. There is still this 5 per cent that you can't explain, that defy explanation. His book on UFOs, provisionally entitled *Open Skies, Closed Minds*, will be published by Simon and Schuster in June 1996.

The absurdist comedy of the MOD's own UFO-watcher turning from sceptic to (qualified) believer speaks to the spooky-woo-woo spirit of the millennium. Now that God, who once wound our sundials, is thought to be dead, human awe has turned to UFO sightings and even alien abductions — in the jargon, *Close Encounters of the Fourth Kind*.

Next weekend the British UFO Research Association will host its eighth International UFO Congress to discuss these and other UFO events. It is sold out. Later this month, Channel 4 will screen a controversial film of an alien autopsy, allegedly shot after the UFO crash at Roswell, New Mexico, in 1947.

Pope has seen the footage: 'I found it gruesome and unpleasant, but then I'd never seen an autopsy before. There were 100 people in the auditorium at the Museum of London. The atmosphere was jolly for a minute, but as the autopsy started and the humans cut up the aliens there was a lot of uneasy shuffling and muffled cries of "Oh, my God!"'

The best documented British UFO sighting, the Rendlesham Forest incident, rests on a sober memo headed 'Unexplained Lights', dated 13 January 1981. It is signed by Lt Col Charles I. Halt of the US Air Force. Halt and his officers saw a pulsing, metallic, triangular object which sent nearby farm animals into a frenzy and left above-background radiation levels in three holes in the ground.

The best documented American UFO sighting is the Roswell incident in 1947. The best abduction features a four-way alien pick-up, involving Manhattan UFOlogist Linda Napolitano, two anonymous security guards and the 'Third Man' — a cover name purportedly to protect the identity of the then UN Secretary-General, Javier Pérez de Cuéllar.

His Excellency denies the abduction. The old saw, Occam's razor — 'No more things should be presumed to exist than are absolutely necessary' — slices up the little green men better than Channel 4's autopsy.

This is not to say that the people who report UFOs are bonkers. Ordinary people do witness such things as bright lights in the sky and should not be lightly mocked; so do military officers, who supply the best-authenticated cases. But there is a battery of good reasons explaining why UFO sightings and reported abductions — even Pope's 5 per cent — have more to do with the vagaries of the human mind than with aliens.

None of this is a match for the first law of storytelling: the exciting explanation will always drive out the boring.

First, bright lights in the sky. Psychologist Michael Persinger, of Canada's Laurentian University, has noted a big statistical correlation between flying saucer reports and earth tremors. He has speculated that electromagnetic pulses, released by the shifting of the earth's tectonic plates, could stimulate images in the mind's eye — the brain's temporal lobe. This would also account for the cutting off of a car's electricity.

Professor Ashley Grossman of Bart's agrees: 'There is an increasing amount of evidence that electro-magnetic pulses can affect brain function. *In vitro* research suggests that there is some sort of sensory perception — you could call it a sixth sense — which some animals have. The brain works on electricity. It's rather like taking your credit card near a large magnet. If someone had a low threshold for temporal lobe epilepsy and seizure, an electro-magnetic pulse could fire off hallucinations.'

But temporal lobe epilepsy can be the first manifestation of a brain tumour. Prof Grossman warns: 'Anyone who sees a UFO or has a semi-mystical experience should have a brain scan. Of course, some experiences could be put down to hysteria. But there could be an underlying biological abnormality triggering the hallucinations.'

Looking back, visions of the Virgin could have been prompted by bio-abnormality. Joan of Arc famously took a long time to burn — maybe as a result of calcified lungs caused by tuberculosis. Had TB reached her brain, it could have triggered the visions. And never underestimate auto-suggestion, the phenomenon which drove the Salem Witches and may be responsible for Pérez de Cuéllar's 'trip'.

Second, Rendlesham. Let's presume Halt and the other Americans saw something in the sky, something which left a radioactive spoor in the forest. Why need it come from outer space? The Pentagon's ultra-secret Black Budget has been responsible for all sorts of weird lights in the sky, clocked by military men such as Halt who would not have been security-cleared for the programme. The post-Sreath bomber, Project Aurora, is currently whizzing around the world being mistaken for a UFO.

Third, Roswell. The UFO air crash is a 'bunch of horse pucky' according to one sceptic, Irving 'Newt' Newton. What actually crashed in 1947 was another secret Pentagon wheeze, Project Mogul, a high altitude balloon checking for radiation from Soviet atomic bombs.

Fourth, the Channel 4 hoax. The curiously humanoid shape of the aliens under the knife chimneys with a line from Thomas Aquinas: 'Angels need an assumed body, not for themselves, but on our account.'

Anatomist Paul O'Higgins of University College, London, who has seen the film, says the aliens 'have our anatomy, plus a collection of relatively common anatomical anomalies: the six digits, the enlarged brain case which you get with hydrocephalus, distended abdomen, lack of umbilicus, membranes over the eyes — easy to do with plasticine. The chance that aliens would look like us by accident are remote.'

The writer Phillip Knightley famously objected, prior to its publication, to the Hitler Diaries hoax played on the *Sunday Times*. Knightley's memo is a classic of journalistic rigour. He asked: 'How thoroughly has the vendor explained where the diaries have been all these years and why they have surfaced now... The crux of the matter is that secrecy and speed work for the con man.'

Thus far, Channel 4 has not released any verifiable detail on the origins of the film — bad scepticism but great showbiz. The *Observer* bets Channel 4 showman-in-chief Michael Grade a case of antipodean, H-bomb-free champagne the Roswell film will be proved to be a hoax before the year is out.

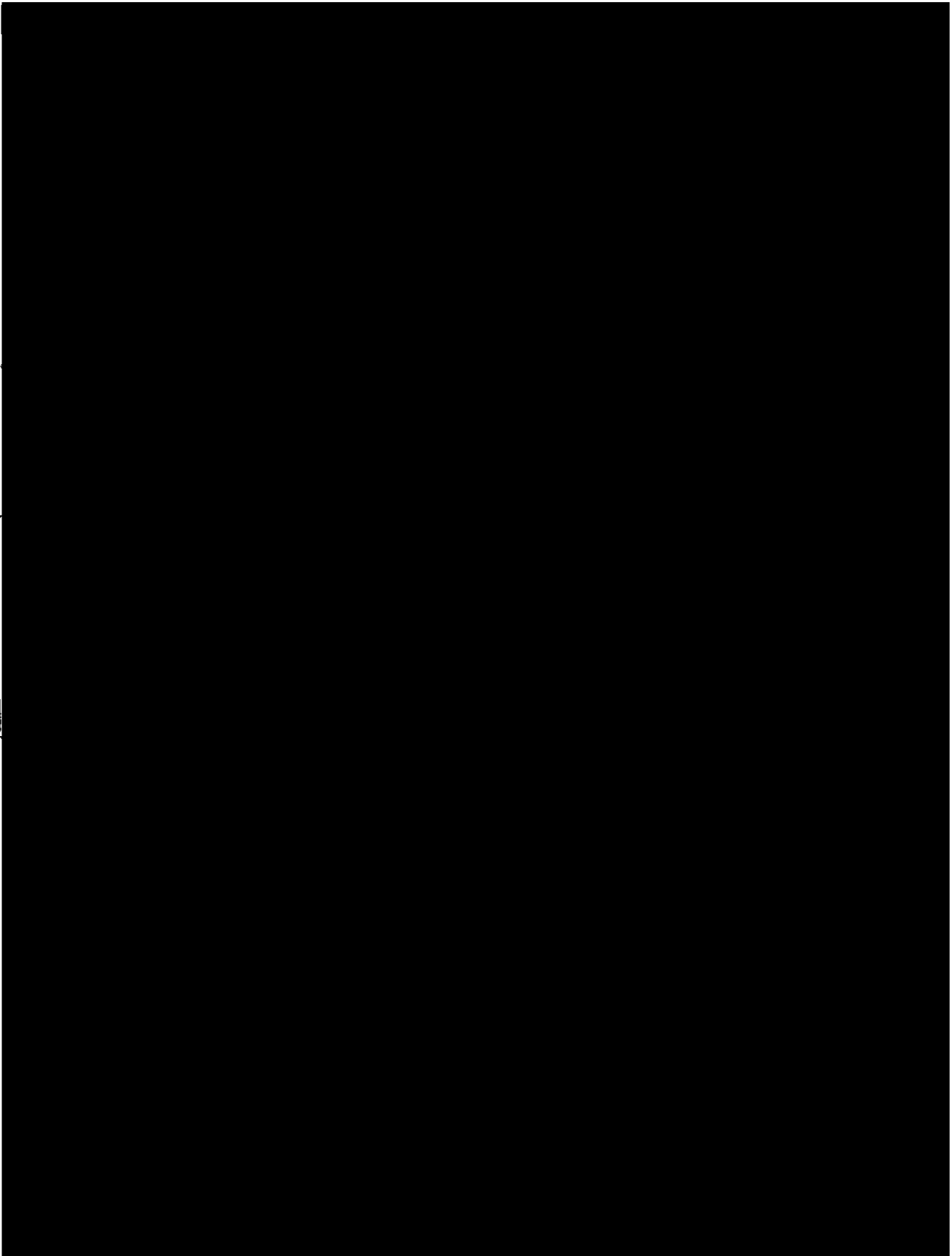

With regard to your letter of 27 March 2003 and my request for copies of files or correspondence connected to Nick Pope and his book Open Skies, Closed Minds, I would like to pose the following questions based on your denial of access to these files:

* You say you have a duty to protect the confidentiality of individuals who correspond with the MOD.

Quite so but at the time Mr. Pope was in correspondence with the MOD regarding his book he was still an employee of the MOD, writing a book based on his experiences whilst in a certain position at the MOD.

As he was an employee of the MOD does this not alter things?

* If you still insist that your initial statement applies I would then apply for copies of the relevant files with all the relevant 'confidential' material erased. I am quite prepared to pay any costs incurred in this exercise.

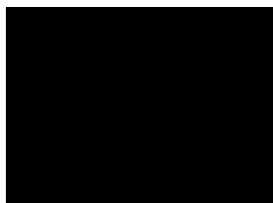
To re-iterate my request:

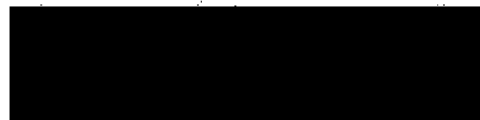
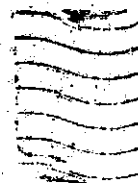
I am requesting copies of all and any internal MOD files or correspondence which deals with Nick Pope's Open Skies, Closed Minds. This includes internal memos generated by the writing of this book, letters to Mr. Pope, letters from Mr. Pope and any associated or relevant material. As noted above, if you insist on the somewhat convoluted 'confidentiality' refusal then I will be happy to pay costs incurred in sanitizing the documents. As Mr. Pope was an MOD employee and as he was writing a book based at least partly on his experiences at the UFO desk I see no real reason why members of the public should not see how the MOD went about dealing with his request to use MOD materials and how the writing of the book impacted on the MOD, all of which should be clear from the materials I am requesting.

If you decide, on the basis of this latest request, to refuse my application, I would ask that you pass this letter to your line manager for their decision. If that is still a refusal then I shall pursue the matter via the Ombudsman.

In addition to the above the request I would like to request a copy of the file D/Sec(AS) 12/5 dealing with UFOs- Close encounter reports, alien entities, abductions etc, which is currently held at the MOD. As with the request above I will be pleased to pay any copying or other costs incurred in obtaining this file.

Thank you for your recent letter.

With regard to your request for a "copy of all and any files or correspondence which deals with Mr Pope and his book, which may have been generated at the MOD", I should inform you that we have a statutory duty under the Data Protection Act 1998 to process personal data lawfully and an obligation under common law to protect the confidentiality of individuals who correspond with the MOD. Correspondence containing information of a personal nature is not therefore released to third parties unless we receive the explicit written consent of the individual concerned or is otherwise permissible under DPA 98. Therefore, unless we receive such consent directly from Mr Pope we will be unable to provide the information you have requested on this occasion.

You also enquired as to whether "RAF Mato" may still hold radar tapes of the Rendlesham Forest incident. HQ MATO was the Headquarters of the Military Air Traffic Organisation and was based at Uxbridge, Middlesex. MATO disbanded on 31 March 2000 and on the same day was integrated into HQ Strike Command. Enquiries at HQ Strike Command have revealed no record of any radar tapes still in existence concerning events at Rendlesham Forest.

TY. If a request for information is eg what are the procedures MOD require prospective authors to follow, then this can be answered factually and if necessary copies of regulations provided. But the correspondent here is seeking material that will a) contain personal data about a third party which MOD is legally obliged to process in accordance with DPA 98 and/or b) contain material that may attract a duty of confidentiality which the MOD will owe to the third party.

I should think it likely that correspondence between Mr Pope and MOD and vice versa re his book would raise issues of confidentiality and that it would therefore be a wise precaution not to disclose it to a third party without consent. Your proposed reply is agreed but I have made a few amendments as follows:

"With regard to your request for a "copy of all and any files or correspondence which deals with Mr Pope and his book, which may have been generated at the MOD" I should inform you that we have ~~statutory duties~~ **a statutory duty** under the Data Protection Act **to process personal data lawfully** and an obligation under common law to protect the ~~privacy~~ **confidentiality** of individuals who correspond with the MOD. 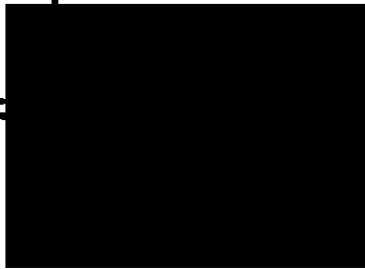
You may recall we discussed a letter I have received from one of our regular correspondents who has requested a copy of all and any files or correspondence we hold concerning a former member of our staff (Mr Pope) and a book he published shortly after leaving the department. I propose to say the following and would be grateful for your advice as to whether the wording is ok.

"With regard to your request for a "copy of all and any files or correspondence which deals with Mr Pope and his book, which may have been generated at the MOD" I should inform you that we have statutory duties under the Data Protection Act and an obligation under common law to protect the privacy of individuals who correspond with the MOD. Correspondence containing information of a personal nature is not therefore released to third parties unless we receive the explicit written consent of the individual concerned. Therefore, unless we receive such consent directly from Mr Pope we will be unable to provide the information you have requested on this occasion".

The reason I have referred specifically to information of a personal nature instead of just correspondence is that we do release copies of 'UFO' reports and correspondence under the Code of Practice, but we remove personal data. I do not think this is the same because even if we removed names etc, it is the contents of the correspondence which is personal to Mr Pope.

I hope this makes sense. I would be grateful for your thoughts.

I wonder if you could assist me with the following enquiries:

- 1) I am doing some research into the MOD's involvement with UFOs and specifically the work carried out by a previous incumbent of the 'UFO desk', Nick Pope.

Mr Pope worked at AS2A between 1991 and 1994. Shortly after his time there he wrote a UFO book called 'Open Skies, Closed Minds', in which he refers to his time in AS2A. I also gather, from speaking to Mr Pope and reading interviews with him that his book generated much internal correspondence at the MOD, as he apparently had to ask for permission to write it.

I would therefore like to request a copy of all and any files or correspondence which deals with Mr Pope and his book, which may have been generated at the MOD. I am making this request under the Freedom of Information Act. If it is not possible to receive copies of such files could you please give me a full written explanation and details of how I can appeal against the decision?

2. I am also doing some research into the 'Rendlesham Forest' incident which took place in 1981 at RAF Bentwaters. I gather, from existing official records, that radar tapes (from RAF Neatishead and other locations) which cover the period of the incident were taken away for study by RAF officials from RAF ~~Mato~~.

Could you answer the following questions please:

- Are there any records at RAF Mato of this incident and/or the removal or study of the Radar tapes?
- Could you tell me what brief RAF Mato fulfils?

Thank you for your assistance in this matter and I look forward to receiving your reply.
